

# Election News

The City's bond referendum election was held on August 24<sup>th</sup>, and the electors voted for approval of issuing bonds for the acquisition of a beachfront park by a vote of 5,025 to 3,436 (59.39% / 40.61%).

The City's election for the selection of candidates for office will be on November 2 with the new Commission taking office November 16, 2010. Commissioners Kent and Partington had no opposition after the qualifying period was over, so they were automatically elected to their seats. That leaves the seats for Mayor and Commissioners in Zones 1 and 3 up for election in November. Candidates for Mayor are Lori Gillooly, our current Zone 1 Com-

missioner, and Ed Kelley, our current Zone 3 Commissioner. Candidates for Zone 1 are Alan Burton, Greg Scull and James Stowers. Candidates for Zone 3 are Rick Boehm and Mike Scudiero.

Turnout for the beachfront bond referendum election in Ormond Beach was 31.6% of the 27,476 registered voters in Ormond Beach. We can do better than that. Don't forget to vote in November! Let's shoot for 100% turnout!




# *Kids Got Talent*

City Commissioner Ed Kelley and City Manager Joyce Shanahan attended the Florida League of Cities annual business meeting and educational conference, an event that provides opportunities for officials to share innovations and best practices for improving city government. The event was held August 19-21 in Hollywood, Florida.

This year's conference theme, "**Creating Community in Tough Times**," was perfect to showcase the conference program that was designed to both educate and provide cost-cutting ideas that make a difference for Florida's citizens.

"The Florida League of Cities is a service-based organization that serves as a catalyst for providing excellence in public service," said Commission Kelley. "This annual conference provided a forum for sharing innovations that can be incorporated into our city's programs at low-to-no-cost. As this is an election year, the conference featured key political forums that allowed city officials to hear from the candidates on issues that matter to our citizens.

General **Russel Honoré**, the commanding general of Joint Task Force Katrina.

The three-day meeting culminated with the election of League officers and board members and the adoption of resolutions related to the member's positions on key federal issues.


