Sanitary Sewer Collection System - Root Control Activity

The City of Ormond Beach will be performing a preventative maintenance project on portions of the sanitary sewer collection system piping to inhibit root growth intrusion. The contractor, Municipal Sales, Inc., will apply an herbicide to control root growth in the collection system in various parts of the City.

The project is planned to be performed in the following listed areas and completed by February 18, 2011. Customers located within the listed portions of the City's sanitary collection system proposed for this activity will be provided additional hand-delivered prior notification.

- Sanitary Sub-System 1-M in the area between S. Beach St. and S. Ridgewood Ave. from Rogers Park Dr. south to the City limits.
- Sanitary Sub-System 2-M in the area between N. Ridgewood Ave. and N. Beach St. from Highland Ave. south to Rogers Park Dr.
- Sanitary Sub-System 3-M in the area between N. Ridgewood Ave. and N. Beach St. from Melrose Ave. south to Dix Ave.
- Sanitary Sub-System 4-M in the area between N. Ridgewood Ave. and N. Yonge St. from Sanchez Ave. south to Dix Ave.
- Sanitary Sub-System 6-M including Old Mill Run, Malaga Ave., the area between S. Center St. and Tropical Lane from Division Ave. south to Hand Ave. and the area between S. Ridgewood Ave. and the railroad tracks from Highland Ave. south to Fleming Ave.

Root growth has been found to be a primary contributor to blockages that occur in collection system mains and service connections. When left untreated, root growth increases the possibility of sewer system back ups and potential overflows in the sanitary collection system. The herbicide application method intends for the root inhibitor product to be contained in the sanitary sewer main and immediate portions of the adjacent service lateral. Sometimes a sulfur or rotten egg odor attributed to the herbicide can be detected inside a connected facility if a drain trap is defective or not functioning properly. If an unordinary odor is detected, please open your windows and ventilate your facility until the odor disappears.
