

Art in the Park

The 39th annual Art in the Park will be held in Rockefeller Gardens on Saturday, April 30, and Sunday, May 1. Thousands of people attended last year's event. This year, there will be approximately 100 participants, including artists and crafters, entertainment, food vendors and activities to delight all visitors.

Art and crafts will be judged. In the fine arts category, a single award of \$1,400 will be made for "Best in Show" which will be displayed at the Ormond Memorial Art Museum. Six others, three fine artists and three crafters will receive a total of six awards: Judges Choice \$350, First Place \$275, and Second Place \$175.

This year, and for the first time, there will be a Children of Ormond Gallery Show sponsored by the National League of American Pen Women, Daytona Beach Branch. The Show will feature works of art from children in the third, fourth and fifth grades in Ormond Beach schools and their theme is "Heroes." The exhibit will be on display inside The Casements from April 25 through May 6. Five (5) special awards will be given to each grade level (a total of 15) along with Best of Show. Awards and a reception will be held on Saturday, April 30, at 3:00 p.m.

There will be arts to please everyone from acrylics to wood, and everything in between. With Mother's Day only a week later on May 8, this is a great event to find unique and lasting gifts from among beautiful paintings, photographs and distinctive pieces of hand crafted work.

While shopping, strolling or dining, there will be a variety of musical entertainment. On Saturday, Docs of Dixie will perform followed by Dan Allen – One Man Band. On Sunday, 2 Guys with Horns and the Docs of Jazz will entertain.

Food vendors will offer an array of items to satisfy every appetite. Greg's Seafood and Bar-B-Que will have ribs, chicken, hamburgers, hotdogs, shrimp, fish and fried food on the menu. Joe's Lemonade will serve a variety of lemonades plus salads, gyros and snacks. Officer Pearson Nominated for Law Enforcement Officer of the Year

In his nomination letter, Sergeant Jim Davis cited Officer Pearson's knack for solving crime through fingerprint evidence as one of Rob's specialties. On two occasions over the last year, Rob's attention to detail resulted in his developing a suspect's fingerprint while investigating a crime. In both of these cases, the suspect was identified, arrested, and charged with numerous crimes within Ormond Beach and other local jurisdictions. Multiple cases could have gone unsolved if it weren't for Rob's skill and diligence.

Officer Pearson is also known for his compassion. He recently found himself in the news when the media heard about how he spent money from his own pocket to help retrieve a young boy's computer game from a pawn shop after it was stolen from his home. Rob was quoted as saying that he wanted to get the boy's game back but did not want the pawn shop owner to be out anything either.

Officer Pearson also volunteers his time as the assistant advisor for the Ormond Beach Police Explorer Post. He dedicates many hours to sharing his knowledge and experience with the young men and women of the post who are the potential law enforcement officers of tomorrow. Before becoming a police officer in 2005, he served as a Community Service Officer with the City.

Officer Pearson will be recognized at the Crime Stoppers 13th Annual Community Banquet on May 18, 2011.



Walking with the Manager

Last Friday, City Manager Joyce Shanahan, with guest walker Leisure Services Director Robert Carolin, walked approximately two miles with a group of seven citizens. The weather was beautiful for the morning walk, which began at The Casements and continued through Rockefeller Gardens, Fortunato Park, over the Granada Bridge, through Bailey Riverbridge Gardens, Cassen Park and dock, and back over the bridge, ending at The Casements.

Mr. Carolin spoke on various issues and answered questions such as the shrub pruning process along the bridge, the City's method of monitoring and controlling growth of invasive plant species, and mistletoe and Spanish moss in the trees. He shared with the group the recent sign unveiling of Ormond Beach's Andy Romano Beachfront Park. The group also discussed the new public art Tarpon fountain in Rockefeller Gardens and the new energy efficient lighting on the bridge and along the parks.

These programs are run through the Athletics Division of the Leisure Services Department.




