DARE Graduation

On Friday, October 28th, Pathways Elementary celebrated the 5th graders D.A.R.E. (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) graduation taught by Officer Stokes. There were about 110 5th graders who graduated from the 10 week course. Every 5th grader who attended the classes graduated. In attendance from the City were Mayor Ed Kelley, City Commissioner Troy Kent, City Manager Joyce Shanahan, Police Chief Andy Osterkamp, Officer Stokes and Officer Cornelius. Mayor Kelley presented every child with a "Key to the City" pin which represents a key to their future.

D.A.R.E. is a drug abuse prevention education program designed to equip elementary school children with knowledge about drug abuse, the consequences of abuse, and skills for resisting peer pressure to experiment with drugs, alcohol and tobacco. Based on the premise that prevention is the only long-term answer to drug abuse, the program includes all 50 states and 53 countries. The D.A.R.E. program is taught in over 75% of the nation's school districts creating a positive atmosphere for students to interact with uniformed law enforcement officers. This unique program uses uniformed law enforcement officers to teach a formal curriculum to students in a classroom setting.

National Prescription Drug Take Back Day

The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) has scheduled another National Prescription Drug Take Back Day on **Saturday, October 29, 2011, from 10:00 am - 2:00 pm.** to provide a venue for persons who want to dispose of unwanted and unused prescription drugs.

National Prescription Drug Take Back Day addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. More than seven million Americans currently abuse prescription drugs, according to the 2009 Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's National Survey on Drug Use and Health. Each day, approximately, 2,500 teens use prescription drugs to get high for the first time according to the Partnership for a Drug Free America. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including the home medicine cabinet.

DEA, in conjunction with state and local law enforcement agencies throughout the United States, conducted National Prescription Drug Take Back Days on Saturday, September 25, 2010, and April 25, 2011. Nearly, 4,000 state and local law enforcement agencies throughout the nation participated in these events collecting more than 309 tons of pills. This event allow citizens to anonymously drop off unwanted or expired drugs which will be disposed of by the DEA.

Four days after last fall's Take-Back Day, Congress passed legislation amending the Controlled Substances Act to allow the DEA to develop a process for people to safely dispose of their prescription drugs. DEA immediately began developing this process after President Obama signed the Safe and Secure Drug Disposal Act of 2010 on October 12. Until that process is complete, DEA will continue to hold Take Back Days every six months.


