5th Annual Police Motorcycle Skills Championship

On Saturday, November 5th, the 5th Annual Bruce Rossmeier's Daytona Harley Davidson Police Motorcycle Skills Championship at Destination Daytona was held. Over 70 motor officers from several different agencies in Florida, and from agencies as far away as Virginia participated. Ormond Beach Officers Borzner, Smith and Pavelka attended. There was about 30 officers in Officer John Borzner's class which was the novice class. He completed the course in 3 minutes and 2 seconds which was the winning time in his class. His time was about 12 seconds faster than the second place rider. The course is de-

signed to make the officers show proficiency and control of their motorcycles and helps them train for real life situations in a controlled environment. It is very important for motor officers to train in this way as it keeps their skills sharp.

Following the competition, an awards ceremony and dinner was held at the Coke Pavilion at Destination Daytona at which time all of the winners received their trophies.

Hygienic Goods Drive to Benefit the Jewish Federation of Volusia and Flagler Counties

The Jewish Federation of Volusia and Flagler Counties, located at 470 Andalusia Avenue, Ormond Beach, was established in 1981 due to the increasing number of requests for assistance made by individuals and families relating to financial stress, care of the aged, child welfare and other personal emergencies. The Jewish Federation is a United Way partner agency and provides food, financial assistance for rent and utilities, furniture, clothing and household goods free to its clients. Since 1996, it has also supported a School Supply Program in which it provides fully stocked backpacks to children in need as referred by school guidance counselors. Since its beginning, it has furnished over 41,000 backpacks to 83 elementary, middle and high schools.

One hundred (100%) percent of all donations go to the people in need. All administrative costs are absorbed by the Jewish Federation. In a typical year, the Jewish Federation's Jerry Doliner Food Bank spends approximately \$70,000 on food; already in 2011, it has spent over \$125,000. It maintains a well-stocked crisis food bank which provides emergency food to people who "fall through the cracks" of the system with such staples as cereals, juices, canned vegetables and fruits, canned meats, peanut butter, pasta, canned and dry milk, paper goods, and other items deemed necessary for survival.

The Jewish Federation is in need of hygienic products for their clients. Items which are greatly needed include toilet tissue, paper towels, laundry detergent, dish soap, and personal hygiene items such as baby wipes, baby bathing products, bath soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothbrushes, toothpaste, razors/blades, feminine hygiene products, etc. **Donations can be dropped off at the following locations through Friday, November 18th.**

On Friday evening, November 4th, the Gallery Exhibit Opening of Remix: "The Second Time Around" was held at The Casements. Next Generation Air Transportation System

Officials from the City of Ormond Beach attended a field hearing of the House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University (ERAU) on Monday, November 7th. Economic Development Director Joe Mannarino and Airport Manager Steven Lichliter attended the meeting chaired by U.S. Representative John Mica (R-FL). The panel discussed an FAA reauthorization bill that would provide a four-year blueprint for development of the Next Generation Air Transportation System (NextGen). FAA Administrator Randy Babbitt, President and CEO of the Aerospace Industries Association, and former FAA Administrator Marion Blakey, and Director of Physical Infrastructure for the Government Accountability Office Gerald Dillingham testified before the Committee. The bill could be ready for the President's signature by Christmas, according to Congressman Mica.

The following day, Mr. Mannarino and Mr. Lichliter attended a symposium on NextGen air traffic control technologies at the Florida NextGen Test Bed facility which is located at the Daytona Beach International Airport. Embry-Riddle currently operates one of three NextGen Test Bed facilities through a partnership with the FAA and approximately 15 private companies. Representatives from ERAU, Boeing, Lockheed Martin, General Electric and other industry partners provided an in-depth overview of systems proposed to upgrade and integrate air traffic control operations nationwide to increase safety, efficiency, and capacity within the National Airspace System (NAS).

Research partners present or identified at the symposium include the ATH Group; Barco; the Boeing Company; Computer Sciences Corp.; the County of Volusia; Daytona Beach International Airport; ENSCO Inc.; Frequentis; General Electric; Harris Corp.; Jeppesen; Lockheed Martin; Mosaic ATM Inc.; Saab-Sensis Corp.; and Volpe National Transportation Systems Center.


