

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, two young women in our community have dedicated nearly 200 hours each on their service project entitled, "Women in History." The museum quality exhibit will be on display at The Casements from February 1 through March 10; and

WHEREAS, Cheyenne Conrad and Heather Larson are members of Girl Scout Troop 450 and juniors at Spruce Creek High School. The "Women in History" exhibit is their Gold Project, which is equivalent to the Boy Scout's Eagle award. The girls were required to complete the leadership and career awards, the 4B's challenge, and an intensive service project, with the project taking approximately 200 hours. The "Women in History" exhibit is a visual exhibit about women that is interesting and informative for all ages, which incorporates Girl Scouting memorabilia to illustrate a timeline; and

WHEREAS, the goal of the project was to successfully create an exhibit about women through history, focusing on women's educational positions, career advancements, political roles, and strides in society. It will inspire girls and help them embody their gender and take pride in all that women have accomplished, as well as informing the community about the past achievements of women. 
