
Ormond Beach Pride Football also received special recognition for their Academic All American Team. There were many smiling faces that evening as the children received their awards!


PAL YDC Program's Marissa Moss in the News Again!

Free Pickleball Clinic

The Nova Community Center offered a **FREE** Pickleball Clinic on Friday, June 8, 2012, from 9:30 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. There was a tutorial of the rules and a demonstration of how the game is played followed by open play.

What is Pickleball? Pickleball is a racquet sport which combines elements of badminton, tennis, and table tennis. The sport is played on a court with the same dimensions as a doubles badminton court. The net is similar to a tennis net, but is mounted two inches lower. The game is played with a hard paddle and a polymer wiffle ball. Although pickleball appears to be very similar to tennis, there are key differences that make pickleball more accessible to a wider range of players.

Originally invented as a backyard pastime, pickleball is now an organized sport represented by national and international governing bodies. Since its inception in 1965, pickleball has spread across the United States and into Canada. The United States Pickleball Association estimates there are more than 100,000 active pickleball players in the US alone.

The daily use of the Nova Community Center is free to City of Ormond Beach residents with proof of residency and just \$3.75/day for non-residents. The Center, located at 440 N. Nova Road, is open Monday through Saturday 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. and Sunday 1:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. For more information, please call Nova Community Center at (386) 676-3252.

The annual cleaning of the ponds at Ames Park was completed last week by Facilities Maintenance crews with the assistance of the Campus Outreach volunteer students.




In Memorial Gardens, Facilities Maintenance crews restored two memorial benches. The wood and frames had deteriorated and the benches received replacement wood and support frames.
