- Lining ball fields



National League of Cities Prescription Drug Program

In June 2010, the City of Ormond Beach launched a program to help provide residents with some relief from the high cost of prescription drugs. Since that time, over 1,700 residents have saved over \$75,000, or an average of approximately 25% on prescription medications. By June 2012, the program had saved residents over \$9.5 million nationwide.

Cards can be printed from the Internet at www.caremark.com/nlc and are available at City offices and facilities at no cost to residents. Residents can visit www.caremark.com/nlc to access program tools or call toll-free 1-888-620-1749 for assistance with the program.

The discount cards may be used by all residents and has no restrictions based on the resident's age, income level, or existing health coverage. However, the prescription card cannot be used in combination with other health insurance prescription coverage. The NLC card can be used when purchasing prescription drugs at approximately ten (10) pharmacies around the City, as well as at more than 60,000 participating retail pharmacies across the country.

The discount card program is administered by CVS Caremark.

Walking with the Manager

On Thursday, July 19, City Manager Joyce Shanahan held her "Walk with the Manager" at 8 a.m. at the South Ormond Neighborhood Center (SONC). The guest walkers were Liviston "Stretch" Edwards, SONC Coordinator, and Lisa Messersmith, Police Athletic League (PAL) Coordinator.

The walk started out with Stretch giving a tour of the SONC to the group. Conversation touched on recent issues with the deck of the splash pad and the changes staff made to address those concerns. As they moved into the building, the "level or standard" of service and quality of the facilities became the topic of conversation. The group was very impressed with the recent improvements in the weight room and gymnasium.

Stretch's underlying conversation to the group was the South Ormond Neighborhood Center's mission to focus on "at-risk" youth in the community, the "education through recreation theme" and the T.E.A.M. philosophy at South Ormond: **T**ogether **E**veryone **A**chieves **M**ore.

During the tour of the South Ormond Neighborhood Center, the close partnership between the South Ormond Neighborhood Center and Ormond Beach PAL was explored. In the Rainforest mural room the process of creating a large scale work of art with children was shared. After enjoying a visit with tigers, elephants and zebras created by children in the PAL/SONC mural partnership; guests explored the reading room, the computer lab, Camp T-Rec, the weight room, the gym and the enjoyed a walk on the trail around the SONC. The last stop on the tour was the ball field.

After completing the trail, guests walked to the PAL house. While walking it was shared that Ormond Beach (OB) PAL is one of the few PAL's in the area to focus more on educational programs than athletic programs. OBPAL has six educational programs: Science on Patrol for elementary and middle school youths; R.E.A.D, Reading, Exploration, Adventure and Discovery; Do the Right Thing; Youth Directors Council; and, Tutors R Us. OBPAL recently received one of two business partners of the year awards from Volusia County Schools. The award was acknowledged by the Florida Education Commissioner in Tampa in June of this year. They also talked about the Youth Director Council (YDC) program and the National Awards received by Gregory Berry and Marissa Moss. As the walkers returned to the SONC, the guest walkers

commented that they were excited to see all of the programs OBPAL offers for youths in the City.
