CMT Workshop Hosts Camp Broadway

The Children's Musical Theatre Workshop hosted Camp Broadway at the Ormond Beach Performing Arts Center on Thursday, August 16th.

Camp Broadway is a nationally recognized five day intensive camp program given in New York City. Camp Broadway came to Ormond Beach to present a special one-day version of the camp for the first time. Camp Broadway specializes in teaching children performance skills in singing, acting, and dancing.

The instructors from the Camp Broadway program are all trained teachers and performers who have Broadway show experience. The day long camp program culminated in a short performance for the parents and family members in the Performing Arts Center Auditorium. It was amazing to see how much the campers were able to learn in only one day.





PRIDE JAMBOREE

Ormond Beach PRIDE Youth Football and Cheer was again awarded the host site of the AYF Florida Youth Football and Cheer Conference Jamboree on Saturday, August 18, 2012. Five programs from Daytona, East Marion, Gainesville, Flagler and the home team Ormond Beach PRIDE met at the Ormond Beach Sports Complex on Championship Field for a series of exhibition games.

Each program brought in up to 5 team levels (K-8 grades) to see how they stacked up against teams in their conference and will play later in the year. The organized scrimmage format for the Jamboree allowed coaches to work with their team in live game situations. During each 20 minute game, the offense ran plays for 10 minutes on running clock. The team then switched to defense for 10 minutes on running clock and were matched up against two separate programs. Additionally, this was a tremendous dress rehearsal for the newly formed Ormond Beach PRIDE cheerleading squads.

An unusual early morning rain shower gave organizers a little scare, however; the sun shined for the majority of the day. The crowd of over 800 fans witnessed some great football from the younger levels (Tiny Mites K-1, Mighty Mites 2-3, Pee Wee 4-5 and Junior Varsity 6-7). However, a series of lightning delays followed and ultimately a cancellation of the Varsity (8) level games.

Ormond Beach PRIDE was fortunate to have been awarded this Jamboree for the second time in its two years of existence. Even though they split the proceeds with the Conference, it is a major fundraiser and helps keep the participation cost down for the parents.

Ormond Beach PRIDE will be hosting their next home game on September 8, 2012, at Championship Field against Hastings. The community is welcome to join in the fun of youth football and cheer.
