Mayor and Commissioners Take Office

On Tuesday, November 20, 2012, the Ormond Beach City Commission began their new terms of office which is for two (2) years ending November 2014.

Prior to taking oaths of office, a reception was held in the City Hall Atrium with approximately 100 guests.

Mayor Ed Kelley was sworn in first followed by City Commissioners James Stowers (Zone 1), Troy Kent (Zone 2), Rick Boehm (Zone 3), and Bill Partington (Zone 4). Mayor Kelley previously served as the Zone 3 City Commissioner from 1994-1997, and from 2005-2010, and has been Mayor since 2010. City Commissioners Kent and Partington have been serving since 2004. City Commissioner Bill Partington served on the Law Enforcement Advisory Board from 2002-2004. City Commissioner James Stowers served on the Historic Landmark Preservation Board from 2009-2010, and City Commissioner Rick Boehm served on the Leisure Services Advisory Board from 2004-

2010, and both are now in their second terms as City Commissioner.

Mayor Kelley, Zone 2, Zone 3 and Zone 4 City Commissioners, Troy Kent, Rick Boehm, and Bill Partington, had no opposition in this fall's election.

Commissioner Bill Partington was again elected to the post of Deputy Mayor by the Commission.






EMPLOYEE HEALTH FAIR

Wellness COVE presented the annual Employee Health Fair that was enjoyed by two hundred employees; they visited 28 health, wellness, and fitness exhibitors and collected information treasures. Many got their blood pressure checked, their eyes examined for glaucoma, their feet typed, information on how to control snoring, advice on healthy ways to manage their stress, and plan for their financial future. Exhibitors included Florida Health Care Plan, MetLife, Humana, Brown & Brown, QuitSmart, Florida Snore Dentist, Lighthearted Living, Jazzercise, Sam's Club, YMCA, and the United Way. In addition, more than 150 employees completed their Health Risk Assessment and received their Personal Wellness report containing Biometrics Body Mass Index, body fat percentage, blood pressure, cholesterol, triglycerides, glucose, and nicotine use.




Basketball Training League

The training league consists of teaching the players basic skills and fundamentals. Each child receives their own basketball and t-shirt for the season.



Countywide Food Drive

From November 12-21, City of Ormond Beach employees donated food toward the annual Countywide Food Drive to benefit the Second Harvest Food Bank. Our staff competed against other Volusia County cities, Volusia County Government, Volusia County Schools, and Daytona State College to see which public agency could donate the most food (in pounds) per employee which will be distributed FREE to all local food banks. **Our City employees donated 6,711 pounds of food!** We'll know next week how we stacked up against other County agencies at a presentation at the December 6th County Council meeting. We doubled last year's donations. We are proud of City staff!

LOCAL HUNGER FACTS (the problem is closer to home than you think)

- 47% of the household members served by Second Harvest are children.
- Among client households with children, 48.4% are single-parent households.
- 26.1% of the households have one or more children 0 to 5 years.
- 19.3% of the households have at least one member age 65 years or older.
- 24.6% of the clients are single-person households.
- 33% of households assisted include at least one employed adult.
- 69% have incomes below the official federal poverty level.
(Federal government definition of poverty: \$22,050 annual income for a family of four.)
- 10% are homeless.
- Approximately 55,000 different people receive food through Second Harvest each week.
- In one year, Second Harvest provides for 14 million meals.
- During the last year, food pantries, kitchens, and shelters have had to turn away clients.
- All Second Harvest donations are distributed free of charge to the needy in Central Florida.

Building Updates at Nova Community Center

Over the Thanksgiving holiday, the Nova Community Center was closed for renovations. The gym floor was sanded and re-finished and permanent pickleball court lines were added. New tile was added to the lobby. On Monday morning, ten (10) pickleball players were the first to use the newly painted courts.
