CAP Cadets Honored at State Competition

The Ormond Beach Municipal Airport and the Ormond Beach Composite Squadron of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP) proudly announce that the Ormond Beach CAP Cadet Color Guard Team competed successfully and won seven trophies in eleven events at the CAP Florida Wing Cadet Competition on December 8, 2012. Teams from ten Florida CAP squadrons journeyed to MacDill Air Force Base in Tampa to compete in this once-a-year, state level event. The Ormond Beach cadets won first place in the "Mile Run" and "In-Ranks Inspection" categories, second place in the "Written Exam" category, third place in the "Indoor Practical Drill" and "Outdoor Practical Drill" categories, and C/SMSgt. Brittani F. Giles won the "Fleet Foot Female" trophy by turning in the fastest mile time of all female cadets at the competition. In the "Overall" category, the Ormond Beach team took the second place state-wide trophy. This represents an extraordinary showing by the Ormond Beach CAP cadets, as this is the first time that the Ormond Beach Composite Squadron has sent a team to this very high profile competition. Under the leadership of Capt. Alexander G. Duarte, 2nd Lt. Andrea D. Giles, and 2nd Lt. Kristen M. Miller, the cadets practiced three days a week for five months, logging about 200 hours of work in preparation to compete. The Ormond Beach Composite Squadron Cadet Color Guard Team is: C/SMSgt. Brittani F. Giles, C/MSgt. Michael P. Gabriel, C/MSgt. Devon W. Giles, C/SSgt. Matthew A. Dye, and C/A1C Corey J. Spitz.

The Ormond Beach Composite Squadron wishes to acknowledge and thank the City of Ormond Beach and Seabreeze High School for allowing the cadets to use their facilities to practice. The squadron also wishes to thank the many squadron members, family members and friends who travelled to Tampa to encourage and support the team, making the Ormond Beach contingent the largest at the competition.

Civil Air Patrol, the official auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force, is a nonprofit organization with more than 61,000 members nationwide, operating a fleet of 550 aircraft. CAP, in its Air Force auxiliary role, performs over 90 percent of domestic U.S. inland search and rescue missions as tasked by the Air Force Rescue Coordination Center and was credited by the AFRCC with saving 54 lives in fiscal year 2011. Its volunteers also perform homeland security, disaster relief and drug interdiction missions at the request of federal, state and local agencies. The members play a leading role in aerospace education and serve as mentors to nearly 27,000 young people currently participating in the CAP cadet programs. CAP received the World Peace Prize in 2011 and has been performing missions for America for 70 years. CAP also participates in Wreaths Across America, an initiative to remember, honor and teach about the sacrifices of U.S. military veterans. Harry Wendelstedt's Umpire Clinic - FREE

The City of Ormond Beach Leisure Services Department is now accepting registration for a 3-day Umpire Clinic which is being offered by the Harry Wendelstedt Umpire School from age 16 through adult. The clinics, beginner and advanced, are being taught by major and minor league umpires on the Wendelstedt staff.

The clinics will be held on three consecutive Saturday mornings, January 19, 26 and February 2, 2013, from 9:00 a.m. until noon in Ormond Beach. Participants are to attend all three dates. Clinics will cover basic fundamentals of a two-man system, plate work, the strike zone and other encountered rules. Advanced umpire training will focus on the obstruction and interference rule.

This clinic is **FREE**; however, registration is **REQUIRED** to be completed and turned in to the Leisure Services Registration Office by noon, January 17th. Minors can only be registered by their parents or court-ordered legal guardian.




