## One Step Closer to the World Series


### *The 2013 Lady Renegades Bring Home the Championship!*

# Be Hurricane Prepared

The 2013 Hurricane Season begins on June 1<sup>st</sup> and continues through November 30<sup>th</sup>. Today, Dr. William Gray and Philip Klotzbach, of Colorado State University, released their Extended Range Forecast of Atlantic Seasonal Hurricane Activity and Landfall Strike Probability for 2013. They are forecasting an above-average hurricane season for 2013. The seasonal average is 11 named storms, 6 becoming hurricanes, and 2 becoming major hurricanes. Dr. Gray and Mr. Klotzbach are predicting 18 named storms, 9 hurricanes, and 4 major hurricanes.

It only takes one storm to hit to make it a bad hurricane season, so try not to focus on the prediction numbers, but focus on preparing your family's disaster plan now – before a storm is approaching. When preparing your plan, here are some things to keep in mind:

**Discuss disaster plans as a family** – Develop a list of things that need to be taken care of in preparing for a disaster. A disaster can be especially frightening for young children. Assemble an "activity kit" so they will have things to do. You can include some of their favorite things such as books, puzzles, games, crayons, markers, paper, scissors, glue, a toy, and a stuffed animal.

**Make evacuation plans** – Decide where you will go if an evacuation order is given and leave well in advance of the approaching storm as evacuation routes could be heavily congested.

**Take inventory of your valuables** – Prepare a list, videotape or photograph your valuables.

**Review your insurance policies** – Do this well in advance of an approaching storm. Once a hurricane watch has been issued, most insurers will not issue new or additional coverage, including flood insurance. Flood damage is not covered under a homeowner's policy. A separate policy must be purchased. For information regarding flood insurance, please visit [www.floodsmart.gov](http://www.floodsmart.gov) which can help you rate your risk, estimate premiums, and find an agent. Keep these documents in a safe place.

**Check your home for vulnerable areas** – roof, windows, garage doors, patio doors, etc., should be checked to determine what protective measures you should make to secure your home in the event of an approaching storm.

**Protect vehicles** – Decide where you will store or park your vehicles, boat, or RV. Remember to check your insurance policies for your vehicles and keep them in a safe place.

**Reduce damage to your property** – You may wish to install window shutters, purchase a generator, trim trees, and double-check tie-down straps and anchors if you live in a mobile home or a manufactured home.

**Special needs** – Make arrangements well in advance of a storm for the care of infants, the elderly, and those with special needs. Persons with special needs should register with the Volusia County Health Department at <http://www.doh.state.fl.us/chd/volusia/SPNS.html>. If someone in your household has a disability or special need, take additional steps to protect them. Create an emergency kit that includes an extra supply of prescription medicines, a list of medications and their dosages; an extra set of eyeglasses and extra hearing-aid batteries; an extra walking device, wheelchair batteries, and oxygen if necessary; extra copies of medical insurance documents and Medicare/Medicaid cards; and a list of doctors, relatives, and friends who should be notified.

**Plan for your pets** – Make plans for your pets whether you stay or evacuate. In addition to food, water, and bowls, your pet's disaster kit should include leashes, toys, bedding, carrier, medications, newspaper, cat litter, plastic bags for waste, license and vaccination documentation. Remember to make plans for large outdoor pets such as horses.

# *Celtic Festival*

“Will ye be wantin’ a bit of haggis with that?” Ormond Beach’s third annual celebration of all things Celtic returns to Rockefeller Gardens on April 19, 20 and 21, 2013. Celtic vendors, Celtic food and, most importantly Celtic music will be featured for the duration of the festival. The festival opens on the evening of April 19 with a whisky tasting and a concert featuring acclaimed Irish harpists Grainne Hambly and William Jackson, as well as the Scots pop band Drever-McGuire-Young.

Everything moves outdoors on Saturday where, in addition to non-stop music on three stages, there will be an opportunity to watch real Highland Games including a Caber Toss, Sheaf Throw and Hammer Toss. Rosie O’Grady’s pipe band will parade the grounds several times each day leading a procession of the gathered clans throughout around the park. There will be plenty of opportunities to fill your plate either with fresh food in the Celtic tradition or more American fare. And, of course, there will be lots of Guinness and other beers to drink.

If the music makes you feel like dancing, be there at 5 p.m. Saturday, April 20, for the céilí – a Celtic dance party. Festival musicians will provide the tunes on fiddle, flute, tin whistle, guitar and bodhrán. Our caller will teach the steps and you’ll be jigging, flinging and stepping in no time.

As soon as the dance is over, our headliners take to the stage for an evening’s entertainment under the stars.

Sunday features more bands, a mid-day “Kirkin’ of the Tartan’ and demonstrations of outdoor skills including axe throwing by the Flying Hawkes, highland games skills and perhaps, a wee bit o’ sheep tipping. Both days have a kids’ zone with crafts and lots of family activities and, of course, plenty of music.

Local musicians who want to join the party are more than welcome to bring their own instruments either day to join the artists in the “jam tent” or at an after hours jam session at Lulu’s Oceanside Grill, 20 S. Atlantic Ave., Ormond Beach.

Daily admission to the Festival is only \$5 per person (children under 12 free). A two-day pass is available for \$8. Advance tickets for Friday’s whiskey tasting are \$26 and tickets for the concert at the Ormond Beach Performing Arts Center are \$18 adults/\$9 children. The advance sale Friday night combo ticket is only \$40. An “all Festival” tickets including Friday night’s whiskey tasting and concert as well as all the activities Saturday and Sunday are available for \$45. 

Category	Sustained Winds	Types of Damage Due to Hurricane Winds
1	74-95 mph 64-82 kt 119-153 km/h	<b>Very dangerous winds will produce some damage:</b> Well-constructed frame homes could have damage to roof, shingles, vinyl siding and gutters. Large branches of trees will snap and shallowly rooted trees may be toppled. Extensive damage to power lines and poles likely will result in power outages that could last a few to several days.
2	96-110 mph 83-95 kt 154-177 km/h	<b>Extremely dangerous winds will cause extensive damage:</b> Well-constructed frame homes could sustain major roof and siding damage. Many shallowly rooted trees will be snapped or uprooted and block numerous roads. Near-total power loss is expected with outages that could last from several days to weeks.
3 (major)	111-129 mph 96-112 kt 178-208 km/h	<b>Devastating damage will occur:</b> Well-built framed homes may incur major damage or removal of roof decking and gable ends. Many trees will be snapped or uprooted, blocking numerous roads. Electricity and water will be unavailable for several days to weeks after the storm passes.
4 (major)	130-156 mph 113-136 kt 209-251 km/h	<b>Catastrophic damage will occur:</b> Well-built framed homes can sustain severe damage with loss of most of the roof structure and/or some exterior walls. Most trees will be snapped or uprooted and power poles downed. Fallen trees and power poles will isolate residential areas. Power outages will last weeks to possibly months. Most of the area will be uninhabitable for weeks or months.
5 (major)	157 mph or higher 137 kt or higher 252 km/h or higher	<b>Catastrophic damage will occur:</b> A high percentage of framed homes will be destroyed, with total roof failure and wall collapse. Fallen trees and power poles will isolate residential areas. Power outages will last for weeks to possibly months. Most of the area will be uninhabitable for weeks or months.
