## Chamber Leadership X




The Ormond Beach Chamber of Commerce offers an annual leadership program supporting growth and development of participants working, living, and learning in our community. The program is comprised of several days of learning with a theme for each day.

Government Day, held on April 18th, showcased the depth and breadth of public service demonstrated in several unique ways. To start the day, City Manager Joyce Shanahan introduced the structure of City government, highlighting the need for reliable, accurate and timely communication in every association with members of the community, elected officials and employees.

Next, Ms. Shanahan, in addition to Fire Chief Bob Mandarino, Police Chief Andy Osterkamp, and Utilities Manager Dave Ponitz, facilitated a mock disaster exercise of an approaching hurricane. Leadership participants took on the role of City Emergency Support Function managers during 'Hurricane Ann,' making decisions for the City's preparations and response to the storm event. The City's Peacetime Emergency Plan

and staff leaders were the tools for guiding the exercise.

Finally, Mayor Ed Kelley and Commissioners Rick Boehm and James Stowers discussed how they were influenced to become a community leader, what they believe are their leadership strengths, and how people can get involved and become a leader in their community even if they are not active in government.

## Tribute to Billy Joel

A New York State of Mind, Tribute to Billy Joel, starring Tony Monaco and The Turnstiles will perform in concert at the Ormond Beach Performing Arts Center on Friday, April 26th, at 7:30 p.m.

Tony Monaco was born into a musical family and began his musical journey at the age of 8. While he was fascinated with the piano, the guitar was a more realistic financial option. As a result, Tony studied guitar with his father, Pat Monaco, and played it as his main instrument until the age of 13, winning both regional and national guitar competitions.

Over the years, his love for keyboards was rekindled when he fell in love with the Hammond organ, eventually leading him back to his first love, the piano. He studied with many private teachers but credits Dave Frank (world renowned jazz pianist) for focusing his efforts. As a result, many of his influences were jazz artists. However, when a close friend suggested he listen to more artists like the recording star known as the "piano man," Billy Joel, he was inspired by Billy's piano style. He learned from Billy and started to emulate his style and licks and fell in love with his lyrics. Tony then started the band "Thrills" where he did extensive touring and recording.

Tony opened for such acts as Foreigner, Quarterflash, Nick Lowe, Juice Newton and Orleans. In 1993, Tony's band was the first in the nation to play a tribute to the "piano man." His band was Tony Monaco and Stormfront. It was at that time that he auditioned for the traveling production of the Broadway show, "Movin' Out." He then moved to Florida and once again decided to form a new band known as "Turnstiles." Billy Joel has said that he may not tour again after his current tour of Australia and perhaps the closest thing to Billy is Tony Monaco. His music brings standing ovations and the sound is dead on! After all, Tony has perfected the sound since 1993.

## **It's time to register for the Ormond Beach Summer Connection Day Camp Program!**

Summer Connection enrollment packets can either be downloaded from the City website, [www.ormondbeach.org](http://www.ormondbeach.org) or picked up at the Ormond Beach Leisure Services Registration Office, 399 N US1. Office Hours: Monday-Thursday 7:30 A.M. – 4:30 p.m.. and Friday 7:30 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Completed enrollment packets are to be dropped off at the Leisure Services Registration Office. Registration packets will be numbered as they are dropped off and will be processed in the order in which they were received. Registration will be on a first-come, first-served basis until all camps are filled.

The programs will be for children ages 6 through 13 (age as of 9/1/13) and will be held at the South Ormond Neighborhood Center, 176 Division Avenue. This year there will be two 4-week sessions of **Summer Connection Day Camp**: from 8:00 A.M. – 5:00 P.M., June 17 - July 12 and July 15 - August 9. Each four week session will be \$200.00 for City of Ormond Beach residents (proof of residency required); and \$300.00 for non-residents.

## Florida Licensing on Wheels

The Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles has implemented the Florida Licensing On Wheels (FLOW) program.

FLOW is a standalone mobile office with technology to provide most motorists' needs. It provides driver license/ID card change of address, renewals, replacements, and renewals and replacements of vehicle registration and disabled parking permits, as well as other needs.

The FLOW brings services to the local communities offering a convenience to citizens while saving them time and gas as well. Beginning on May 6<sup>th</sup>, the FLOW will be in the City Hall parking lot, 22 South Beach Street, from 12:00 p.m. (Noon) until 4:00 p.m. on the first Monday of every month providing this service to our citizens. Alternate arrangements will be made when the first Monday is a holiday.

In addition to beginning monthly visits in May, the FLOW will be participating at Picnic on the Plaza for the Earth Day celebration on April 25<sup>th</sup> at City Hall, and at the Public Safety Awareness Day on April 27<sup>th</sup> at Prince of Peace Church, located at 600 S. Nova Road.

# Child and Babysitting Safety Training

In April 2012, the Ormond Beach Fire Department began offering the citizens of Ormond Beach a **Child And Babysitting Safety (CABS)** training program through the American Safety & Health Institute. The Department held its latest CABS course on Saturday, April 13<sup>th</sup>, at the training room in Fire Station #92, 189 S. Nova Road.

This course provides young people with basic skill training and information necessary in caring for infants and children. The program teaches the importance of responsibility, recognizing an emergency, emergency action steps, personal safety, fire safety, water safety, infant care, basic first aid, choking management, and child/infant CPR. These are skills the young adults can use any time in our community when they encounter an emergency whether it is at the beach, at school, a neighborhood pool, or a sporting event. By having trained young adults in our community helps increase the quality of life and makes Ormond Beach a safer place for everyone. The program is designed for young people (ages 11-16) who will be babysitting or providing child and infant care. Participants receive a CABS card upon successful completion of the course. Due to the limited number of participants that the department can accommodate, the program is only offered to City residents. The training program is approximately 6 hours with a maximum class size of 20 students. Instructors for the course are Captain Meghan Quartier and Driver Engineer Lynn Taylor.

The cost of the training is \$10/person and participants receive a *Child and Babysitting Safety* packet. The next offering is planned to be in November 2013.





## Tours at The Casements

During their spring break, over 60 students from Breathitt High School in Jackson, Kentucky, travelled to the Ormond Beach area and spent time last Thursday touring The Casements and Ormond Memorial Art Museum and Gardens.

Our docents sat the large group of students down in the Gallery and gave them a brief history of the house, and then broke down into smaller groups for a tour of the home. Students were very interested to learn about Mr. Rockefeller and amazed to see the transformation and efforts the City put forth to restore the home for all to enjoy.


