## Crimestoppers Annual Banquet

The Crime Stoppers Law Enforcement Officer of the Year nominees were honored during the Crime Stoppers 15th Annual Community Banquet held on May 15, 2013, at the Ocean Center in Daytona Beach.

This year, Officer John Borzner was selected by the Ormond Beach Police Department as its nominee. On January 13, 2013, Officer Borzner responded to a reported theft of a truck and trailer. Officer Borzner knew of a home nearby that was known for previous criminal activity. Upon checking that home, he observed two suspects with the stolen truck and trailer. After confronting the suspects, Officer Borzner was struck by the suspects' vehicle. The suspects were later apprehended and several stolen firearms were recovered as well as an additional stolen vehicle. This is just one example of Officer Borzner's bravery and dedication as a police officer.

We are proud of Officer Borzner and all of the law enforcement personnel who help to make our citizens safe.

# Police Unity Tour

Officer Keith Feder, Sergeant Jamie Gogarty and Lieutenant Jesse Godfrey returned this week from Washington, D.C., after completing the 2013 "Police Unity Tour." In August of 2012, these officers, as well as Officer Richard Rubin Officer (who could not attend due to a family emergency), committed to raising two thousand dollars apiece and to train for the demanding 250 mile bicycle ride over a three day period from Portsmouth, Virginia, to Washington, D.C.

The bicycle ride ended at the National Law Enforcement Officers' Memorial as part of National Police Week. In 1962, President Kennedy proclaimed May 15th as National Peace Officers' Memorial Day and the calendar week in which May 15th falls, as National Police Week. Established by a joint resolution of Congress in 1962, National Police Week pays special recognition to law enforcement officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty for the safety and protection of others.

In addition to fundraising and riding, each of the officers wore a metal bracelet with the name of one of the recently fallen officers. Once at the Memorial, the bracelets were presented to family members of the fallen officer or a designee from their respective Department.

The Building Maintenance Section maintains seven fountains at different facilities within the City on a routine basis. Proper levels of Chlorine, Cyan Uric Acid, PH and Alkalinity are tested and levels adjusted to have the fountains looking their best and support the longevity of the fountains' finish.



And as part of the Fire Administration move to Fire Station 91, Building Maintenance lent a helping hand transporting furniture from the Chief's office at City Hall to their new quarters.
