
Several energetic volunteers have assisted the Leisure Services Community Events Division with a variety of needed maintenance projects.

The music, costume, and set selection for the show will be as diverse and engaging as the choreography and the dancers themselves. Following the Saturday afternoon performance, the Artistic Directors and company dancers will discuss their work with the audience. After consistently selling out performances, SCDT's highly anticipated season closing performance promises to be equally outstanding.

Surfscape Contemporary Dance Theatre is consistently recognized for its professional and compelling contemporary dance performances and boasts an exciting annual calendar of performances, events, dance workshops, and community outreach projects. The company tours nationally and anticipates a European tour in the coming year. Weather Station Sensors Repair Work

On Friday, June 7, Station 91 firefighters set up their ladder truck (as a training exercise) to provide access to the weather station sensors located atop the shade structure pole to assist in determining the problem with the rain gauge.

Once they inspected the rain gauge, they saw it was about $\frac{3}{4}$ full of water (due to rain that fell the day before) and the tip of the funnel was clogged with debris that looked to be berries of some sort, likely something birds dropped.

They contacted the IT Department for assistance. When IT Manager Ned Huhta responded, they gave him safety instructions and guided him out on the ladder to inspect the weather station. The obstruction was cleared and the rain gauge was verified as working again and reporting rainfall.
