Congressman DeSantis Tours Ormond Beach Businesses

On Thursday, August 8, Mayor Ed Kelley and Economic Development Director Joe Mannarino hosted Congressman Ron DeSantis, who represents the Sixth District of Florida, and his aide Naomi Weiss in touring two leading Ormond Beach manufacturing companies; Energizer and Hudson Technology. The first stop in the tour was the Energizer Plant located at 1190 North US 1, which was conducted by Energizer Managers Mischelle Romesberg, Ron Neal, and Jose Lago. The tour included a walk-through of the production areas and a look at some of the new capital equipment and renovated facilities. Congressman DeSantis had the opportunity to address a group of Energizer employees during their quarterly awards ceremony.


