## Airport Celebrates Completion of Taxiway Alpha Project

A ribbon-cutting to celebrate completion of the Taxiway Alpha Relocation and General Airfield Improvements Project was held at the Ormond Beach Municipal Airport on Monday, August 19<sup>th</sup>. Mayor Ed Kelley and Commissioner Bill Partington attended along with City staff, representatives of Hoyle, Tanner and Associates, Inc., Halifax Paving, Inc., members of the local aviation business community and the Civil Air Patrol.

The event was opened with a performance by the award-winning color guard team from the Ormond Beach Composite Squadron of the Civil Air Patrol. Mayor Kelley addressed the assembled guests to discuss the importance of the project and the benefits to both the airport and the City at large. The Mayor emphasized that while approximately \$2.2 million was invested largely in the local economy to construct the project, the cost to the City was only about \$41,000. The City's share of the project is funded by revenue generated through leasing of airport property and other airport usage fees.

Construction of a new Taxiway Alpha was the largest phase of the multi-part project, resulting in a new taxiway surface constructed in accordance with the Airport Master Plan, and including run-up areas at the east and west ends of the taxiway which will reduce taxiway congestion and improve traffic flow management. Other elements of the project include the rehabilitation of Taxiway Charlie, the realignment of Taxiway Echo, the construction of a public-use heliport, and the construction of a new compass rose.

The mural was dedicated on December 5, 1999, and it has been on display at the South Ormond Neighborhood Center since that time for the enjoyment of the entire community.

The mural has been framed and protected with Plexiglas to preserve it for future generations to enjoy. VITAS Innovative Hospice Care graciously assisted this effort by providing the funding for the mural's preservation.

## Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Grant Funding

The City just recently learned that it will be receiving a VOCA grant for the fourteenth year. The Police Department has been receiving VOCA grant funding since 2000. Including the new grant approval for fiscal year 2013-2014, the Police Department will have received over a half a million dollars from this program.

The VOCA program was established by the U.S. Department of Justice with the passage of the Victims of Crime Act of 1984. The funding for the program is federal and passes through the State of Florida through its Office of Attorney General to provide the City of Ormond Beach Police Department with the resources to assist all crime victims to fully understand and exercise their rights established by the legislature. Advocates are used to assist in cases of assault, domestic violence, child abuse, elder abuse and many other cases. Advocates assist victims in receiving appropriate notifications of court actions, in receiving referrals to support agencies, and in participating in the Victim's Crime Compensation Program.


FLOW brings services to the local communities offering a convenience to citizens while saving them time and gas. The next date will be Monday, September 9<sup>th</sup>.
