Water Distribution System Disinfection

The City of Ormond Beach Utilities Division will temporarily modify the disinfectant used for the City's potable (drinking) water system. Beginning on October 7th, and continuing through October 28th, disinfection of the water distribution system will be performed with application of free chlorine (a stronger disinfectant) rather than chloramines (a longer-lasting disinfectant comprised of combined chlorine-ammonia).



This temporary disinfectant conversion, in conjunction with a coordinated flushing exercise, is a common practice for enhancing the effectiveness and reliability of disinfection in water distribution systems and is recommended by the Department of Environmental Protection. The normal use of the chloramines disinfectant will resume upon completion of the conversion period.

During this period, the water continues to be of the highest quality and totally safe to drink although customers may experience a slight difference in the taste and odor of the water as a result of the alternate disinfectant used.

Customers on dialysis using proportioning machines to prepare dialysate are advised to contact their physician to obtain the appropriate steps to accommodate this change in water disinfectant use. Customers having fish tanks or aquatic species are advised to contact a professional aquarist to minimize any adverse effects on these items associated with chlorine.

John Anderson Dr. Roadway Improvements

Masci Construction, the City's contractor, will be setting up well points for dewatering at the intersection of Dormont Drive and John Anderson Drive. Due to the work required to make the force main connections, most of this intersection will be barricaded.

Masci Construction will provide a single lane access on the east side of the intersection for both north and south bound local traffic. All non-local traffic is encouraged to use the detours at N. Halifax Drive and Standish Drive.

Dewatering will take place through Tuesday, October 8th, barring any unforeseen complications. Excavation of the area is scheduled to begin on Monday, October 7th. For Monday and Tuesday (October 7th and 8th), it would be best for residents living north of Dormont Drive to enter/exit north to Halifax Drive and those living to the south to enter/exit south to John Anderson Drive.

Florida Licensing On Wheels

The Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles "Florida Licensing On Wheels" (FLOW) mobile unit will be at City Hall on Monday, October 7th, from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.

FLOW is a standalone mobile office with technology to provide most motorists' needs. It provides drivers license/ID card change of address, renewals, replacements, and renewals and replacements of vehicle registration and disabled parking permits, as well as other needs. The only thing FLOW does not provide is for the drivers' license road test.

FLOW brings services to the local communities offering a convenience to citizens while saving them time and gas.

King of the Grill



