Saturday, October 19th, was an afternoon of celebration and joy at The Casements. The north lawn welcomed a crowd to witness the dedication of the Centennial Gazebo. Director of Leisure Services Robert Carolin welcomed the group of approximately 300 who came to take part in the celebration. Troy Kent, Commissioner Zone 2, addressed the crowd and the Proclamation was read by Bill Partington, Deputy Mayor and Zone 4 Commissioner. Centennial Co-Chairmen Kathie and Vic Liviccori, along with Phyllis Lowry, Guild President, unveiled the bronze plaque which The Casements Guild presented to the City commemorating the 100 year anniversary of The Casements.

Following the ceremony, the public was invited into The Casements for refreshments, music and a video of Rockefeller during his time at The Casements. The video is on loan from the Rockefeller Archives for one year. The Centennial Timeline covered the walls of the Dance Room depicting one hundred years of The Casements history. The display will remain up for an entire year for visitors to enjoy. This was the first day of the celebration which continues throughout the next year to celebrate 100 years of this remarkable home. 
WALKING WITH THE MANAGER
