Pine Trail Elementary School Project

Fifteen gifted students from Mary Albert's second grade class at Pine Trail Elementary School visited Central Park Tuesday morning to take in the sights of several local birds. Their mission was to continue working on the Althouse Trail identification markers with local bird species.

Last year this energetic teacher brought a group of second grade students to the park to identify several local foliage and fauna growing in the park. Informative wooden markers are now posted in the park describing the many trees, shrubs, bark and leaves they discovered on their journey through the park. Each marker also contains some interesting and fun facts.

This new group of students were guided through the park by City staff and Mr. Chuck Tague, a representative from the Audubon Society. Several different species of birds were seen including the warbler, a short-tailed hawk, a turkey vulture and an osprey. Mr. Tague shared many stories and fun facts about birds including their habits and signs of their presence in the park. He also shared many samples of eggs and nests which the children were able to hold and look at up close and personal.

This was a very exciting experience at the park for the children, their teacher as well as Recreation Manager Stefan Sibley and Casements Coordinator Siobhan Daly. The group will meet several times before designing the final markers.





YARD SALE

Last Saturday, October 26, the Animal Control Division of the Police Department held its first yard sale to help with the cost of feeding and proper veterinarian care of homeless cats that are part of the Trap/Neuter/Release (TNR) program.

In September 2002, the City Commission gave the Police Department the authority to implement measures to reduce and eliminate feral cat colonies. The TNR program was then set in place. A City Ordinance was written prohibiting the feeding of feral cats, unless the citizen is a registered colony caretaker of Ormond Beach.

After carefully searching, a location was found and the property owner completed the consent forms. Volunteers were recruited, and after a Designated Colony Caregiver form was signed and background checks completed, these caring volunteers were trained to assist with this program.

In 2004, procedures for TNR were set in place which include trapping the kitties, testing for diseases and parasites, spaying or neutering, vaccinating, and then "tipping" the ears. Feeding and water stations are set up, and the cats are provided with food and water daily at designated stations. They are also monitored for any injuries or illness and all medical records including proof of sterilization and vaccination are maintained.

When the Ormond Beach Animal Service started this program there were 100 cats, 4 feeding stations, and 5-8 volunteer colony feeders. An Animal Control Officer monitors the colony weekly, and assists in the feeding. A few cats have been added but the number is down to approximately 40 cats. Some of the original cats from 2004 are still there, some were adopted and others have passed due to age and living out their life.

There are two active TNR programs in the City of Ormond Beach at this time. One is on the mainland which the Ormond Beach Animal Service does not assist in as it is privately owned. One is on the beachside and is the program that Ormond Beach Animal Service has monitored since 2004 with its volunteers. There are a few veterinarians in the area who assist with low or no cost care, and they, as well as all the volunteers are very much appreciated. This program could not be done without them!

The City's website www.ormondbeach.org has a "Purchase Show Tickets" button on the lower left side of the screen which, when clicked, connects to the ticketing site.

Feedback from ticket buyers is overwhelmingly positive, and they praise the convenience and ease of use of this system. Features of the online ticketing system include the ability to purchase tickets 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, as well as the ability to purchase tickets using a tablet or smart phone.

The Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles "Florida Licensing On Wheels" (FLOW) mobile unit will be at City Hall on Monday, November 4th, from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.

FLOW is a standalone mobile office with technology to provide most motorists' needs. It provides drivers license/ID card change of address, renewals, replacements, and renewals and replacements of vehicle registration and disabled parking permits, as well as other needs. The only thing FLOW does not provide is for the drivers' license road test.
