

No Parking in front of Beachfront Park

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) recently informed the City of Ormond Beach that it was going to prohibit on street parking adjacent to the northbound lane of South Atlantic Avenue (A1A) in front Andy Romano Beachfront Park.

The FDOT recently installed “no parking” signs along this section of roadway and **once temporary traffic barricades are removed** from the former parking spaces, the **Ormond Beach Police Department will begin enforcing the parking restrictions.**

Road Closure John Anderson Dr. at Neptune Ave.

John Anderson Drive at Neptune Avenue will remain closed to through traffic until April 30th. The extended closure is to allow stormwater and utility improvements to be made from Royal Palm Avenue to Neptune Avenue which need to occur before final stormwater utilities can be constructed at Neptune Avenue. Child And Babysitting Safety Training

The Ormond Beach Fire Department will be offering for the citizens of Ormond Beach a Child And Babysitting Safety (CABS) training program through the American Safety & Health Institute. The Department will be offering a CABS course on Saturday, April 5th, from 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. at the training room in Fire Station #92 which is located at 189 S. Nova Road.

This course will provide young people with basic skill training and information that are necessary in caring for infants and children. This program will teach the importance of responsibility, recognizing an emergency, emergency action steps, personal safety, fire safety, water safety, infant care, basic first aid, choking management, and child/infant CPR. The program is designed for young people (ages 11-16) who will be babysitting or providing child and infant care. Participants will receive a CABS card upon successful completion of the course.

The cost of the training will be \$10/person and participants will receive a Child and Babysitting Safety packet. Class size is limited. Please contact Fire Administration at 676-3255 for information on registration. Participants may bring lunch, or may purchase lunch at eateries nearby. School dress code will apply.

Summer camp scholarships are available to income-eligible and children with special needs through Volusia County's Community Assistance Division.

Families with children ages 5-12 who meet residency and income requirements are encouraged to apply for scholarships. To be eligible, 5 year old children must have completed kindergarten. Children must be entering first through sixth grade. Scholarship awards are based on income-eligibility and will be awarded according to funding availability.

Scholarship applications will be available on April 10, 2014, at all Volusia County public libraries and the Human Services offices at 123 W. Indiana Ave., Deland; 250 N. Beach St., Daytona Beach, 107 E. Canal Street, New Smyrna Beach, and 775 Harley Strickland Blvd., Suite 104, Orange City. Applications will also be posted online at www.volusia.org/community_assistance/applications.htm.

After April 29, 2014, applications may be submitted in person or by mail to the Volusia County Community Assistance Division, 110 W. Rich Ave., Deland, Florida 32720. Faxed applications will not be accepted. Applications may not be submitted to this address until April 29, 2014. Applications for eligible clients will be placed on a waiting list until an opening becomes available. The Sinatra fans in the audience showed their appreciation with thunderous applause after each song.




