There was live music, adoptable animals, and food to make it an enjoyable afternoon for everyone. Crowds of Earth and pet-loving people converged on the Plaza learning how to bring green practices into their lives. This year, green included Farmers Market vendors with their fruits, vegetables, grains, spices and herbs.

A local elementary school accepted the City's invitation to the event. One hundred and seventy (170) students from Ormond Beach Elementary School kindergarten, first grade, and second grade classes walked over for the day and brought with them plenty of smiles and energy as they attended several orchestrated activities and enjoyed visiting all the vendors. Mayor Ed Kelley met with all the students and talked with them about how the City protects the environment and offered them some great advice on what they can do to protect the Earth. Tooke State Park Rangers brought along some examples of animals that live in Ormond Beach and gave the children lots of information about them, their importance and why we need to protect them.

# The Casements Centennial Fashion Show




Fabulous fashion and wonderful weather made for a great event at The Casements on Friday, April 11th.

The Royal Guardsmen, featuring four original members, recorded the #2 hit "Snoopy vs. The Red Baron" in 1966. That song stayed on the charts for twelve weeks and was certified platinum with sales of over one million records.

Oldies duo, The Dukes, opened the show with an energetic set. It was an outstanding lineup of musical talent. The audience of lovers of rock and roll oldies loved every minute of the show.

# Sanchez Park Site Improvements



Site improvements were recently completed at Sanchez Park by Tooke Construction Services, Inc. Two concrete parking areas were constructed to provide three handicap accessible spaces and access aisles near the restroom building and playground area.

Approximately 500 linear feet of sidewalk was installed from both park main entrances to provide safe and accessible pedestrian movement within the park. Staff designed the project in-house, and a \$25,000 CDBG grant paid for the construction costs since all the improvements were ADA accessible related.



## Florida Licensing on Wheels

The Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles "Florida Licensing On Wheels" (FLOW) mobile unit will be at City Hall on Tuesday, April 29th, from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.

FLOW is a standalone mobile office with technology to provide most motorists' needs. It provides drivers license/ID card change of address, renewals, replacements, and renewals and replacements of vehicle registration and disabled parking permits, as well as other needs. The only thing FLOW does not provide is for the drivers' license road test.



FLOW brings services to the local communities offering a convenience to citizens while saving them time and gas.
