Item #1 – Meeting Call to Order

Mayor Kelley called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Item #2 – Invocation

Rabbi Bruce Tucker, Beth Judah Messianic Congregation, gave the invocation.

Item #3 – Pledge of Allegiance

Mayor Kelley led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Item #4A – Detective Briana Drahos-Mathis – Crime Stoppers' Spirit of Law Enforcement Award

Mayor Kelley stated that Crime Stoppers worked with law enforcement agencies in the 7th Judicial Circuit Court by providing the Crime Stoppers' Anonymous Tip Line, which served Volusia, Flagler, Putnam, and St. Johns counties and allowed citizens to provide information anonymously to law enforcement. He stated that the information provided to the tip line may help solve crimes. He stated that the Crime Stoppers' Law Enforcement Office of the Year nominees were honored during the Crime Stoppers' 16th Annual Community Banquet held May 14, 2014, at the Ocean Center in Daytona Beach. He stated that Ormond Beach Police Detective Briana Drahos-Mathis received the Spirit of Law Enforcement Award and that the city was extremely proud of her.

Mayor Kelley stated that Detective Mathis had 15 years of law enforcement experience, ten of which were with the Ormond Beach Police Department. He stated that her knowledge and experience were often called upon during major criminal investigations

which resulted in successful prosecutions, such as in a recent case involving gang activity which led to the closing of several open cases. He stated that Detective Mathis had demonstrated initiative and skill throughout the course of investigations, solving multiple cases and going above and beyond the customary investigative methods to bring closure to the victims and families involved. He proclaimed May 20, 2014, as a day to honor Detective Briana Drahos-Mathis in the City of Ormond Beach and urged everyone to join him in showing their appreciation.

Mayor Kelley stated that the previous evening the Police Chief held an awards ceremony for the city's police officers. He stated that it was the first of what would become an annual event. He stated that Detective Mathis had been recognized there, as were other police officers. He stated that the city had a great Police Department and that the city was grateful to Detective Mathis and the other officers for their service.

Item #4B – Pop Warner Scholar Awards

Mayor Kelley explained that Pop Warner was the nation's largest youth football and cheerleading organization, with nearly 400,000 participants from every state. He stated that Pop Warner programs sought to develop well-rounded young men and women who learned not only the fundamentals of football and cheerleading, but also the importance of education in an atmosphere conducive to developing sound character while having a good time, as well as promoting integrity, leadership, and academics. He noted that participants were required to maintain academic standards in order to participate. He stated that the Ormond Beach Pop Warner Sandcrabs Youth Football and Cheerleading Association had been participating in football and cheerleading activities since the year 2000. He noted that in 14 seasons there had been multiple cheerleading squads and football teams that had won championships at the state and Southeast Regional levels.

Mayor Kelley explained that although the parents, fans, board members, and founding fathers of the organization were very proud of all the successes on the field and sidelines, what they were most proud of was the accomplishments off the field and in the classroom. He stated that the Ormond Beach Sandcrabs produced over 50 students that year who qualified as Academic All-Americans, with five students placing in the top 35 in their grade in the nation. He explained that in order to achieve that status, a participant must maintain a 96% average in all of their core classes and serve their communities by volunteering in a variety of roles. He stated that the Ormond Beach Academic All-Americans represented one of the highest totals in the state of Florida. He proclaimed May 20, 2014, as a day to recognize the Pop Warner Academic All Americans in the City of Ormond Beach and urged all residents to join him in acknowledging the accomplishments of the young scholar athletes.

Item #4C – Ormond Beach Gymnastics Team

Mayor Kelley stated that the Ormond Beach Gymnastics Program has been in operation for the past 35 years, catering to both girls and boys from recreational and competitive levels. He stated that the program offered varying levels of classes for the recreational gymnast and the AAU level 2-9 for competitive gymnasts. He explained that the program was designed to get kids involved in a sport that would condition their minds as well as their bodies. He stated that throughout the season the team worked together to learn their routines for this season and put together a fantastic effort, winning medals and ribbons at every meet. He stated that at the state competition the team brought home over 30 medals and ribbons combined, including some first place finishes and an AAU State Floor Title, won by the team's modified option gymnast. He stated that the City of Ormond Beach was very proud of the Ormond Beach Gymnastics Team and their accomplishments, and grateful to their coach, family members, and everyone contributing to their success. He proclaimed May 21, 2014, as Ormond Beach Gymnastics Team Day in the City of Ormond Beach and urged all residents to join with him in paying tribute to the Ormond Beach Gymnastics Team as outstanding representatives of the city.

Coach George Postell, Gymnastics Program Coordinator, stated that last weekend two of the city's gymnasts competed in the SEC Championships for the state of Florida. He noted that they were the only two gymnasts out of the Ormond Beach area to attend the competition. He stated that one gymnast won third place on vault and fourth place all around and another won fifth place all around for their age division. He explained that they placed that highly out of 700 girls competing. He stated that all of the girls did a great job and they were very proud of them.

Commissioner Kent stated that he read the item but was going to vote consistently with his long standing position on change orders. He explained that he pulled the item from the consent agenda in order to have the opportunity to vote “no.”

Mayor Kelley stated that he agreed with Commissioner Kent about change orders generally but explained that in this instance the city extended the contract and caused the work to be extended. He noted that the Commission did not like change orders but noted that this one was caused by the fault of the city, as the work has not been included in the original scope of services and that was why he would support it.

Item #7C – Replacement of Chiller

Mayor Kelley stated that five years ago the Commission was asked to replace the chiller in City Hall at a cost of over \$300,000. He stated that by staff waiting, it saved \$40,000 over the estimated cost and \$100,000 over the cost five years prior.

Commissioner Kent stated that he wanted to give Mayor Kelley credit for that. He stated that five years ago Mayor Kelley had said that the chiller would last another five years and it did.

Item #7G & 7H – Police and Fire Employee Contracts

Mayor Kelley complimented staff and those negotiating the collective bargaining agreements. He noted that the city just needed to have the state stay out of local governments to let them take care of themselves and allow the process to work more effectively.

Mr. Ric Goss, Planning Director, stated that this item was a land use plan amendment as a result of an annexation back in March. He stated that the applicant’s attorney had requested that the land use and zoning be brought to the Commission together, explaining that there had been some concerns about what was allowed in the county versus the city. He stated that this amendment was reviewed by the Planning Board, who recommended approval, and that it also went to the Volusia Growth Management Committee (VGMC), who also recommended approval. He stated that the land use designation that would be provided would be compatible with the county.

Mr. Rob Merrell, attorney for property owner, stated that he was very much in support of this item and the next item on the agenda. He thanked Mr. Goss and his staff and City Attorney Randy Hayes and his staff, noting that he believed that everyone in both of those offices had some conversation with him about this property. He stated that staff had been extremely accommodating. He explained that the annexation was a result of receiving utilities from Ormond Beach and becoming contiguous to the city limits. He

noted that the property owner had concerns about doing what he had been able to do with the property in the county once he was annexed into the city. He stated that staff did a great job of alleviating those concerns, and he wished to publicly express his thanks.

Commissioner Boehm moved, seconded by Commissioner Stowers, for approval of Ordinance No. 2014-21, on first reading, as read by title only.

Item #11 – Reports, Suggestions, Requests

Upcoming Meetings – Summer Calendar

Ms. Joyce Shanahan, City Manager, reminded the City Commission that on Monday, June 2, 2014, at 5:30 p.m. they would have a Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) Workshop with a City Commission meeting following at 7:00 p.m. She stated that there would be a regular City Commission meeting on Tuesday, June 17, 2014, at 7:00 p.m., preceded by a Brainstorming Session at 5:30 p.m.

Ms. Shanahan stated that there were currently two meetings scheduled in July, the first being the Operating Budget Workshop scheduled for Monday, July 28, 2014, at 5:30 p.m. and a City Commission Meeting on Tuesday, July 29, 2014, at 7:00 p.m. where the tentative millage would be set. She asked the Commission whether they preferred to have both meetings on the same day or on two separate days, noting it was changed the previous year to one day.

Mayor Kelley and Commissioner Kent both voiced their preference for both meetings being the same day.

Ms. Shanahan suggested moving the Operating Budget Workshop to Tuesday, July 29, 2014, prior to the City Commission Meeting, at 5:30 p.m. She noted that if the workshop did not finish prior to the City Commission Meeting, it could be reconvened afterwards.

Ms. Shanahan noted that in August, Tuesday, August 5, 2014, was National Night Out and so the regular City Commission Meeting was scheduled for Wednesday, August 6, 2014.

Florida League of Cities Lifetime Achievement Award

Ms. Shanahan stated that in front of the Commission she had placed the nomination form for the annual E. Harris Drew Municipal Official Lifetime Achievement Award for the Florida League of Cities (FLOC). She noted that the city had never made a nomination before. She explained that she wanted to provide the Commission with the form and paperwork in case they had any interest in nominating anyone. She stated that if they

had a nomination, to let her know and staff would prepare that item for consideration at their next meeting.

Movies on the Halifax

Ms. Shanahan stated that Movies on the Halifax would be held on Friday, June 6, 2014, and the movie shown would be *Frozen*.

Memorial Day

Ms. Shanahan stated that Monday, May 26, 2014, was Memorial Day. She stated that the city's Memorial Day Service would begin at 9:00 a.m. at Rockefeller Gardens.

Baseball

Commissioner Kent stated that his son's baseball team, the Tigers, was officially eliminated from the playoffs the previous evening. He stated that the boys had a great time and learned a lot.

Garden

Commissioner Kent stated that his garden was doing amazingly. He stated that a few months prior he was talking to Commissioner Stowers after a workshop, and he was telling him about his fall and winter garden. He stated that everything in his garden was growing and looking great and he had a great yield of fresh green beans.

Fluoride

Commissioner Kent noted that Mr. Schultz had spoken about GMOs and Monsanto, and that Mayor Kelley had referenced Dr. Oz's statements on the subject. He stated that he looked up Dr. Oz's opinion on fluoridated water. He explained that Dr. Oz spoke about water fluoridation on a show episode titled "How Safe Is Your Drinking Water?" and advocated using a water filtration system to remove fluoride from water. He further explained that Dr. Oz said that he uses a reverse osmosis system to remove fluoride from his family's water.

Playful City

Commissioner Boehm congratulated Leisure Services Director Robert Carolin and the Leisure Services Department for again receiving the designation from Kaboom in partnership with the Humana Foundation as a 2014 Playful City USA honoree. He noted that Ormond Beach was the only city in Volusia County to receive the designation, as well as one of 26 cities in the state of Florida and 206 in the country. He explained that the designation was awarded based on the quality of play available for children within the city. He stated that it was the third year in a row that the city received that honor. He stated that he was proud that Ormond Beach received that significant national award.

Florida Georgia Line – Brian Kelley

Commissioner Boehm stated that he noticed Mayor Kelley's son, Brian Kelley, recently purchased a home and asked if that was to house all of the awards he had won with his country music duo Florida Georgia Line. He noted that the Billboard Music Awards were on the previous week and Florida Georgia Line won another award.

Mayor Kelley stated that he would be attending the Country Music Television (CMT) Awards in June and the Country Music Association Awards in November.

Commissioner Boehm stated that he was continually amazed at the recognition that Brian Kelley received and that he never failed to mention Ormond Beach. He asked Mayor Kelley to speak about a television program coming up featuring Brian Kelley and his family.

Mayor Kelley stated that the show would air on Thursday, May 22, 2014, at 10:00 p.m. on CMT and show behind the scenes how Brian Kelley started and scenes with his family. He stated that Florida Georgia Line would also appear at 9:00 p.m. that evening on CBS for a salute to the troops with 15 other stars.

Commissioner Boehm asked Mayor Kelley if he would be on the program on Thursday night.

Mayor Kelley stated that he would and that Ormond Beach would also be featured, noting that several parks, restaurants, City Hall, and Seabreeze High School would be included.

Memorial Day

Commissioner Boehm noted that the city always honored veterans whenever possible and put on nice events for them. He stated that the city's Memorial Day Service in Rockefeller Gardens was always very special and he encouraged all to attend.

Crime Stoppers' Awards

Commissioner Partington stated that it was his pleasure to represent the city at the Crime Stoppers' event the previous week. He stated that Detective Mathis represented the city well. He noted that he had attended those awards the past six or seven years and that he came in contact with a lot of law enforcement in his daily work as an attorney. He stated that the city had fantastic representation from the police department each year, but finally seeing someone win the overall award for all four counties was outstanding. He stated that it was great to see Detective Mathis' excitement when she realized she won, as well as the camaraderie and support from the other members of the Police Department in attendance. He stated that seeing the honest disappointment on Chief Osterkamp's face when the county award was announced and she did not win was great, as well.

Election

Commissioner Partington stated that he filed his paperwork to officially run for the office of City Commissioner for Zone 4. He stated that it had been a pleasure working with the current Commission, and he felt that there were things they had started that they wanted to see through to fruition. He stated that like Commissioner Kent he was "in it to win it."

Mayor Kelley noted that Commissioner Boehm also submitted his paperwork but did not mention it.

FDOT Granada Bridge Work

Commissioner Stowers noted that he already spoke to Ms. Shanahan about the traffic on Granada Boulevard, but he wanted to mention it. He explained that his office was located on Granada Boulevard and he watched traffic back up all day and drove over the bridge and experienced it firsthand. He stated that he saw in the newspaper that this was standard business for Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and they had just completed a similar project on a bridge in New Smyrna Beach. He asked if staff could find out the hours that FDOT worked on the bridge in New Smyrna Beach, specifically if they worked during the daytime. He lamented the start of the work being Memorial Day weekend. He stated that it was a mess traffic-wise that day and would continue to be for three weeks if they were going to stick to that schedule.

Ms. Shanahan stated that she had asked the Engineering Department to check with FDOT about getting the work done at night, if possible. She stated that she believed that they did not work on Friday and were done by 3:30 p.m. each day. She stated that staff would look into a resolution.

Police Department Awards

Mayor Kelley stated that the Police Department Awards Ceremony the night before was a great event. He stated that the last award given was for lifesaving and an officer who was on his way home took a 911 call he was close by and went in and performed CPR on an individual until the fire department arrived and saved that individual's life.

VCOG

Mayor Kelley stated that there had been a Volusia Council of Governments (VCOG) meeting that week and the issue of homelessness was discussed. He stated that they hoped to have information soon to discuss.

Election

Mayor Kelley stated that he also turned in his paperwork to declare his candidacy for Mayor. He stated that it had been fantastic to work with the City Commission, City Manager, City Attorney, and staff. He stated that he was also "in it to win it."
