Korean War Veterans Honored



At the July 29th City Commission meeting, Mayor Kelley and the City Commissioners gratefully took the opportunity to recognize Ormond Beach Korean War veterans for their service. Although sometimes referred to as the “Forgotten War” because it has been overshadowed by the more immediate memories of Vietnam, Desert Storm and the 50th anniversary of World War II, there is no doubt that the fighting that took place between 1950 and 1953 in Korea was as vicious as any war.

At the urging of the City Commission, Leisure Services staff used the media and local veteran chapters to gather the names of living local Korean War veterans. Invitations were mailed to over 140 Ormond Beach residents who served in our Armed Forces during the Korean War. Over 70 veterans were in attendance.



Mayor Kelley read a proclamation expressing appreciation and proclaimed July 29, 2014, as a day to celebrate our Korean War veterans and urged all City residents to observe and support a patriotic and heartfelt

remembrance to all those who served and died for

our country during the Korean War.

Mayor Kelley then read the names of all the Ormond Beach Korean War veterans who responded. Photos were taken of the veterans with the Mayor and the City Commissioners. Each veteran was given a personalized proclamation honoring their efforts.



City Parks

The Leisure Services Department Parks staff continues to ensure our parks are always looking their best. The raised boardwalk in Central Park spanning from Hand Avenue to Division Avenue was pressure cleaned last week as were the gazebo at Joyce Ebbets Pier and the pavilion in Central Park II. Florida Licensing on Wheels

FLOW is a standalone mobile office with technology to provide most motorists' needs. It provides drivers license/ID card change of address, renewals, replacements, and renewals and replacements of vehicle registration and disabled parking permits, as well as other needs. The only thing FLOW does not provide is for the drivers' license road test.

FLOW brings services to the local communities offering a convenience to citizens while saving them time and gas.



Rules for the "REEL in the FUN" Kids Fishing Tournament Bailey Riverbridge Gardens, 1 North Beach Street (NW corner of Granada Bridge)

1. Registration is required prior to the event. Must be an Ormond Beach resident to register.
 2. Open to the first 40 teams.
 3. Teams consist of (1) adult and up to (2) children.
 4. Check-in is 8:00am - 8:30am. The tournament shall run from 9:00am to 11:00am. The sounding of the horn will start and finish the tournament. Winners will be awarded at 11:30am.
 5. Adult supervision is required for all age groups.
 6. All fishing rules of the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission will apply.
 7. The tournament is catch and release only.
 8. Contestants are responsible for providing all necessary supplies to fish in the tournament (fishing pole, fishing line, bait, hooks, etc.).
 9. Adults can help bait hooks, net fish, remove fish hooks and untangle lines, but **MAY NOT** cast and retrieve for the children.
 10. Only one pole in the water at a time per child (contestants can have back-ups ready).
 11. All anglers must fish from fishing pier or shoreline. Do not get in the water. Waders are not allowed.
 12. Due to the number of participants and close quarters, only live and/or dead bait will be allowed. No casting of lures or artificial bait permitted.
 13. 1st, 2nd & 3rd place prizes and awards will be presented for Largest Game Fish in each age category. The largest fish will be determined by weight. **Tiebreaker**- next largest fish and/or most fish caught will determine winner.
- Age Categories are as follows:**
- Ages 4 - 6
 - Ages 7 - 9
 - Ages 10 - 12
14. All participants and adult supervisors must show good sportsmanship at all times.
 15. Please do not leave litter at the fishing site.


