
The next Casements Camera Club show will be March, 2015. The spring show will feature black and white photography.




PARK MAINTENANCE CONTINUES



With the growing season in full force, Parks Maintenance staff has had to focus on the overgrowth in Central Park recently, especially along pier walkways and sidewalks. Keeping pathways clear is an ongoing job for our busy staff.

911 Signage



Vandals recently struck the parking lot located on Hand Avenue near Central Park. The 9-1-1 Emergency sign which gives the location's address to be given to 9-1-1 emergency dispatchers, was pulled out of the ground by the vandals and found in another location in the park.

Parks Maintenance staff quickly replaced the sign which provides critically important location information in case of an emergency. Every second counts in an emergency and by providing the street address to the 9-1-1 dispatcher, emergency responders are able to arrive at the scene quickly saving valuable time.





Coffee with a Cop

Officers from the Ormond Beach Police Department and community members will come together in an informal, neutral space to discuss community issues, build relationships, and enjoy a cup of coffee.

“Coffee with a Cop” provides a unique opportunity for community members to ask questions and learn more about the department’s work in Ormond Beach’s neighborhoods.

The majority of public contact with law enforcement happens during emergencies and/or emotional situations. Those situations are not always the most effective times for relationship building with the community and some community members may feel that officers are unapproachable on the street. “Coffee with a Cop” breaks down barriers and allows for relaxed, one-on-one interaction.

“Coffee with a Cop” is a national initiative supported by the United States Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services. Similar events are being held across the country as local police departments strive to make lasting connections with the communities they serve.

The program aims to advance the practice of community policing through improving relationships between police officers and community members one cup of coffee at a time.
