BLUE HIGHWAY IN CONCERT

Bluegrass music group, Blue Highway, performed at the Ormond Beach Performing Arts Center on Saturday, January 31st. Blue Highway is currently the most played group on Bluegrass radio in the United States, and their most recent album, "The Game" stayed at #1 on the Bluegrass Music chart for three straight months in 2014.



Blue Highway has been nominated for two Grammy Awards, and has received multiple awards from the International Bluegrass Music Association and the Society for the Preservation of Bluegrass Music in America. They have also won a Dove Award from the Gospel Music Association for their unique blend of Southern Gospel and Bluegrass.

The Blue Highway concert attracted many music fans, some of whom traveled long distances to attend the concert. It was an excellent concert that was a special treat for all the bluegrass music lovers in the audience.

Off Kilter in Concert

Off Kilter will perform at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, February 14th, at the Performing Arts Center, located at 399 North U.S. 1.

The first time he heard the sound of the bagpipes as a child, Jamie (James) Holton knew that he wanted to play the bagpipes because the sound captured his imagination and it looked like so much fun. Born and raised in Ormond Beach, the Seabreeze High School graduate began playing the bagpipes at an early age. Jamie said, "I quickly found out that playing the bagpipes could be lucrative for me. A neighbor used to pay me not to practice when he was home," he laughs.

Some years later, Jamie was hired as a musician at Disney World, where he worked for twenty-five years. While working at Disney, he came up with idea of putting together a band that featured the bagpipes. Disney executives liked the idea, and the band Off Kilter was born. Off Kilter became a popular attraction at Epcot Center's Canada Pavilion, where the kilt wearing Celtic rockers played to huge crowds six days a week for an unprecedented run of seventeen years.

Off Kilter performs regularly now throughout the country at Scottish Highland games. Their legions of loyal fans follow them, and many travel long distances just to see them. Jamie Holton said, "I am so honored to have the opportunity to play in my home town of Ormond Beach. My Mom still lives there and this homecoming is a thrill for me."

Jamie Holton is a full-time firefighter for the City of Orlando and is the bagpipe instructor for the Orlando Firefighters Pipes and Drums. The group of firefighters play for official City of Orlando events and are featured each year in the Citrus Bowl Parade. The Orlando Firefighters Pipes and Drums will perform as special guests to open the concert.

At Fortunato Park, staff replaced broken pickets and repaired deck board. Railing that was vandalized under the bridge at Rockefeller Gardens was also repaired.


