Lori was born in Titusville and moved to Deland at the age of one, becoming a graduate of Deland High School. She went on to earn her degree in Early Childhood Education from Milligan College in Tennessee.

Prior to coming to work for the City of Ormond Beach, Lori was employed with Volusia County Schools at Deland Middle School where she worked as a teaching assistant for over ten years. During this time, Lori's talent working with young people and those with disabilities really flourished.

In 2005, Lori began her employment with the City of Ormond Beach as a summer camp counselor with the Camp T-Rec program. In 2007, she was hired as a part-time therapeutic recreation assistant. In 2011, Lori was promoted to the Nova Community Center Coordinator.

Lori is extremely dedicated to her job and the people she serves. She played an instrumental role in securing funds from Volusia County for scholarships for Camp T-Rec. In order to develop the best possible programs, Lori partners with local businesses such as the Daytona International Speedway and Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University. She developed a free after school program for Ormond residents at the Nova Community Center where children ages four and up can go to play various sports and do arts and crafts. This will help serve those children who are going home to an empty household after school as well as getting children engaged in an exercise program and actively involved in safe, healthy activities.

The Nova gym is now full Monday through Friday morning thanks to the pickleball program Lori has been promoting and it is becoming an increasingly popular sport for area seniors. Her number one passion is assisting those with special needs and throughout the year she runs a number of Challenger sports programs, a new Challenger arts program, and the annual STARS pageant.

Lori is the first one to offer her time to volunteer for a project or assist a coworker in need. She recently took part in a breast cancer walk and spearheaded a very successful clothing and food drive benefiting a local homeless shelter.

Lori has a tremendous impact on our community and her coworkers and we appreciate her here at the City of Ormond Beach.

## Ormond CAP Participates in Hurricane Exercise

The Ormond Beach Composite Squadron of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP) participated with County and State personnel in a three day, statewide hurricane exercise this week.

Initiated by the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM), the 2015 Florida Statewide Hurricane Exercise included a simulated activation of the State Emergency Response Team (SERT). The SERT exercise tests Florida's emergency plans and procedures for a potential hurricane landfall, in preparation for the upcoming Atlantic hurricane season. Along with federal, state, county, local and private-sector partners, the SERT will simulate emergency response efforts to manage an evolving hurricane scenario.

The 2015 Statewide Hurricane Exercise is designed to test multiple phases of emergency management partnerships and their roles in responding to a disaster and assisting the survivors. This year's exercise centers on a scenario in which two simulated hurricanes impact different regions of Florida one week apart.



Senior Members of the Ormond Beach CAP manned the military desk at the Volusia County Emergency Operations Center, and CAP aircrews launched from the Ormond Beach Municipal Airport to provide airborne, high resolution photo reconnaissance to County and State agencies charged with monitoring and responding to the impact and aftermath of a hurricane landfall.

Civil Air Patrol, the official auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force, is a nonprofit organization with more than 61,000 members nationwide, operating

a fleet of 550 aircraft. CAP, in its Air Force auxiliary role, performs over 90 percent of domestic U.S. inland search and rescue missions as tasked by the Air Force Rescue Coordination Center. Its volunteers also perform homeland security, disaster relief and drug interdiction missions at the request of federal, state and local agencies. The members play a leading role in aerospace education and serve as mentors to nearly 27,000 young people currently participating in the CAP cadet programs.

CAP received the World Peace Prize in 2011 and has been performing missions for America for 70 years. CAP also participates in Wreaths Across America, an initiative to remember, honor and teach about the sacrifices of U.S. military veterans.




# Watercolor Workshops

## Children’s Musical Theatre



# Free Legal Workshop

Community Legal Services of Mid-Florida (CLSMF) has partnered with the City of Ormond Beach to offer free quarterly workshops to interested individuals.

The next quarterly workshop topic is paternity, time sharing and child support and will be held on Thursday, June 4<sup>th</sup>, from 3:30-5:00 p.m. The workshop will be held in Conference Room 103 in City Hall located at 22 S. Beach Street. Conference Room 103 is located just before the elevator on the first floor when entering City Hall from the breezeway between the Library and City Hall.

During the workshop, a specific legal topic will be presented by a pro bono attorney. After the presentation, individuals can get their generic questions answered.

If attendees wish to meet one-on-one with a pro bono attorney regarding their specific situation, they will need to indicate so on the sign-in sheet upon their arrival and they will be contacted at a later date, by phone, to have an intake completed to establish eligibility for services. Intakes will not be completed at the quarterly workshops. Attendees who wish to have a one-on-one meeting with a pro bono attorney are encouraged to speak with Julie Rademacher, Pro Bono Coordinator, after the workshop has concluded.




