

ORMOND BEACH PAL BRUINS WIN TOURNAMENT!



The Ormond Beach PAL (OBPAL) "Bruins" 8th Grade Boys Basketball team traveled to Miami, FL this past weekend to participate in the United States Specialty Sports Association (USSSA) Miami Hoopfest National Basketball Qualifier.

The Bruin's finished first overall in Division 2 National Qualifier! Winning this tournament has now qualified the Bruin's 8th Grade team for the

USSSA State Championships in Jupiter, Florida June 12 – 14 and the USSSA National Championships in Cocoa, FL June 25 – 28.

The team played against several well known basketball programs including: Florida Vipers, South Florida Roaring Tigers, and Miami Elite in pool play. The Bruin's went 1 of 3 in pool play, then won back to back games in the Division 2 bracket play to reach the finals. The Bruins defeated Elev8 Youth Basketball (58 - 34) in the semifinal game and The Dream Chasers (49 - 47) in the Finals.

Kevin Beans (#35) a student at Campbell Beach Middle School and five year PAL participant received the tournament's "Most Valuable Player" honors, averaging double figure scoring and rebounding in all games played. Brennan Keil (#21), a student at St. Brendan, and Jacques Edwards, a student at Calvary Christian Academy, received all-tournament honors.

R.E.A.D. Exhibition

Approximately 75 children, parents, grandparents, friends and community members attended the 2015 R.E.A.D. (Reading, Exploration, Adventure and Discovery) program opening reception at Ormond Beach Elementary School on Thursday, May 21, 2015. The exhibition featured 21 books created by children in the third, fourth and fifth grades attending Ormond Beach Elementary School.



R.E.A.D. is a dynamic educational format that incorporates the arts of reader's theaters and bookmaking in a program designed to strengthen reading skills in the areas of fluency, comprehension and vocabulary. During part one of the program, participants worked with tutors Robbin Durden and Jeanne Neat, and Officer Jay Brennan to strengthen their skills in reading fluency and comprehension through reader's theater presentations and group storytelling.

During the second part of the program, students had the opportunity to write a story and create the book currently featured in the exhibition. Working with award-winning artist and Community Program Coordinator Lisa Messersmith and the program educational instructors, the youths explored paragraph development and story progression to write a fictional tale. Once the tale was complete, the young authors created illustrations, embossed covers and assembled their unique art book.

This year marks the 10th year of the R.E.A.D. program partnership with the Ormond Beach Police Athletic League and Ormond Beach Elementary School. Since starting the program in 2005, tutors, members of the Ormond Beach Police Department and the Ormond Beach Police Athletic League have guided children 7 to 11 years of age in writing and illustrating their own short story. Two hundred and four unique art books have been exhibited and written over the last 10 years.

We thank the OBPAL Youth Directors Council, who were great hosts during the exhibition reception.

We hope to see you for the show beginning at 8:30pm.




Summer Camp Preparation




