This year, Officer Lauren Sanders was selected by the Ormond Beach Police Department as its nominee. Officer Sanders was nominated for various reasons, but especially because of her diligent work as the agency's DUI officer. In an effort to keep citizens safe, 14 nights a month she tours city streets searching for drivers who might be under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Her ability to find and arrest intoxicated motorists made her the top officer in 2015 in Ormond Beach with 35 DUI arrests. She has become one of the department's DUI experts. Officer Sanders also handles all crash investigations that occur on her shift, using her expertise to conduct the investigations. She completed 50 crash investigation reports in 2015.

Officer Sanders, a former Police Explorer, is an Explorer Advisor.

Public Safety Announcement

There has been an increase in vehicle burglaries and stolen vehicles located at private residences. Motorcycle and Bicycle Safety Awareness Month

This May, the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) is reminding motorists to share the road with motorcycles and bicycles in recognition of Motorcycle and Bicycle Safety Awareness Month.

“Motorcycles and bicycles have all of the privileges, rights and responsibilities on the road as motorists,” said DHSMV Executive Director Terry L. Rhodes. “When you are behind the wheel, look out for one another. Follow the rules of the road and drive cautiously around motorcycles and bicycles.”

Preliminary data from 2015 shows the following:

“Drivers should always be alert and watch for motorcycles and bicycles,” said Colonel Gene Spaulding, Director of the Florida Highway Patrol. “Safety is FHP’s number one priority and it’s crucial that all drivers use caution around vulnerable road users.”

While motorcycle crashes represented less than three percent of all crashes in 2015, motorcycle fatalities made up 19 percent of all traffic fatalities and 11 percent of all serious injuries. Florida is consistently one of the top three states in the country when looking at motorcycle fatality and crash data. Motorists are reminded never to share the lane with a motorcycle, maintain a four-second buffer zone between you and a motorcyclist and increase space when encountering bad weather and road conditions. Do not follow too closely behind a motorcycle or bicycle.

In 2015, bicycle crashes represented two percent of all crashes, approximately five percent of fatalities and about 4.5 percent of all serious injuries. **In Florida, a bicycle is legally defined as a vehicle and has all of the privileges, rights and responsibilities on public roads (except for expressways) that a motor vehicle operator does.** Of the bicycle fatalities in 2015, the bicyclist was listed as the contributing cause 79 percent of the time. Motorists and bicyclists should refer to the official Florida Driver License Handbook for more safety tips about operating on roadways.

This month, DHSMV is partnering with the Florida Department of Transportation, Florida Sheriffs Association, Florida Police Chiefs Association and Ride Smart Florida to remind motorists that there is only one road and we must share it.



“Florida’s weather is inviting to motorcyclists from around the country and Florida has a lot of motorcyclists on the road, so it is important for all motorists to watch out for each other,” said Lora Hollingsworth, Chief Safety Officer for the Florida Department of Transportation. “From two wheels to eighteen wheels, we all have the responsibility to drive safely and share the road.”

“The first objective of our Florida Sheriffs is to protect the citizens that we serve,” said Sheriff Sadie Darnell, Alachua County Sheriff. “As the President of the Florida Sheriffs Association, and on behalf of our Florida Sheriffs, I fully endorse and support the DHSMV’s motorcycle and bicycle safety campaign that will take place during the month of May.”

“Sharing the space on our roads with bicycles and motorcycles is essential to safe and responsible driving,” said Winter Park Police Chief Brett Railey, president of the Florida Police Chiefs Association. “The FPCA wants to see both drivers and riders throughout Florida look out for each other.”

Free Elder Smart Workshop

Community Legal Services of Mid-Florida (CLSMF) has partnered with the City of Ormond Beach to offer free quarterly workshops to interested individuals.

The next quarterly workshop topic is Elder Smart. The purpose is to educate elders about common types of financial scams they may run into, and how to protect themselves from them. The workshop will be held on Thursday, June 2nd, from 3:30-5:00 p.m. in Conference Room 103 in City Hall located at 22 S. Beach Street. Conference Room 103 is located just before the elevator on the first floor when entering City Hall from the breezeway between the Library and City Hall.

During each workshop, a specific legal topic will be presented by a pro bono attorney. After the presentation, individuals can get their generic questions answered.

If attendees wish to meet one-on-one with a pro bono attorney regarding their specific situation, they will need to indicate so on the sign-in sheet upon their arrival and they will be contacted at a later date, by phone, to have an intake completed to establish eligibility for services. Intakes will not be completed at the quarterly workshops. Attendees who wish to have a one-on-one meeting with a pro bono attorney are encouraged to speak with Julie Rademacher, Pro Bono Coordinator, after the workshop has concluded.


