Public Works Street Section Sign Shop Prepares for 2009 Hurricane Season



The 2009 Hurricane Season will begin June 1st and end on November 30th. In preparation for the sea-

son the Street Section Sign Shop has been researching a method to increase the ability to secure the 9" street name signs at intersections in Tropical Storm force or Hurricane wind conditions. Depicted in the pictures is a "twist bracket" that is being tested by many municipalities and the FDOT.

The "twist bracket" is securely fastened to the existing pole and is bolted completely through it.



The cost of this bracket is comparable in price to the "cross and cap" configuration.

If this design is successful, it will reduce the number of street name signs replaced after a high wind event. The Sign Shop will be implementing the "twist bracket" as they replace the 9" street names with the new high intensity sheeting required by FDOT.


Reynolds, Smith & Hill (RS&H) updated the project schedule based on their best assessment of the required remaining elements, including Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) required reviews and approvals.

The newly received project schedule reflects the time lost due to the developer's modifications to the Development of Regional Impact (DRI) basically from July into December, 2008. While RS&H prepared the draft Methodology Letter of Understanding (MLOU) traffic methodology document in June, RS&H had to wait for the final resolution of the proposed DRI modifications to complete the MLOU and address all of FDOT's questions about the development program. The revised schedule shows the Draft Interchange Report being prepared by

mid-August, and the Final report completed in late October. Anticipated FDOT and FHWA review time has also been incorporated into the schedule. Previously, the completion of the Final Report was expected in July 2009.

FDOT indicated yesterday that RS&H should have the signed MLOU by the end of the week. RS&H has coordinated with FDOT on preparing a 2008 model validation report, which has been approved, to ensure FDOT concurrence with the base year model. RS&H has used that model to forecast year 2016 and 2026 volumes, and are using that information along with the existing conditions traffic counts to prepare the design traffic and the traffic operational analyses. This work is ongoing and should be completed within the next couple of weeks. Once they have that information, RS&H will be able to assess the future year operational concerns, and develop alternatives to alleviate these deficiencies.

Should the City Commission wish RS&H to send a representative to a future City Commission meeting to discuss this delay, RS&H will be glad to do so.



Reuse System Storage and Pumping Facility

Wednesday April 22nd the Ribbon Cutting Ceremony was held for the Reuse Storage and Pumping Facility project located at The Public Works Complex on N. Orchard Street.



The project includes the construction of a 6,800 gallons per minute variable speed pumping station and a 4 million gallon (MG) prestressed concrete ground storage tank. Meadors Construction Company, Inc., from Jacksonville, Florida, was awarded the contract on March 4, 2008 for a contract amount of \$3,029,000. Construction started on May 5, 2008 and Substantial Completion of the facility was April 1, 2009. The project was

partially funded from two grants from the Saint John's River Water Management District (SJRWMD). They included \$638,000 from the Regional Aquifer Management Program, and \$580,000 from the Water Protection and Sustainability Program, for a total grant funding of \$1,218,000.

The facility will be the main pumping station serving the City's reuse system customers which include over 900 residential customers, two golf courses,



recreational facilities, and other public facilities. Approximately 2.80 million gallons per day

(MGD) of reuse water is pumped on average to serve the current reuse system customers. The new storage tank is interconnected with the City's existing 3 MG storage tank to provide a



total of 7 MG of available storage. The new facility will be instrumental in supporting the future expansion of the reuse system. The design is currently underway to extend reuse water to the subdivisions of Breakaway Trails, and Hunters Ridge, and Riverbend Golf Course. It is estimated that an additional 2.70 MGD of reuse water will be used to serve these areas.

TOWN HALL BUDGET MEETINGS

The City of Ormond Beach is beginning to develop its budget for fiscal year 2009-10. Given the current economic conditions, significant declines are expected in the revenue available to support City services. As a result, program and service reductions may occur.

Mayor Fred Costello suggested that each City Commissioner host a zone workshop and take suggestions and input from citizens and business owners on service priorities at a series of town hall meetings.
