The Ormond Beach Police Explorers attended the 2016 Florida Association of Police Explorers State Competition which was held in Orlando, from June 19 through June 25.

The explorers who attended and were on the competition

team were Explorer Chief James Carmody, Explorer Captain Armein Bourbour, Explorer Sergeant Kirsten Scherer, and Explorer Dakota Bejo.

The competition consisted of 31 total departments/teams. The Ormond Beach Police Department (OBPD) Explorers overall rank was 16 out of the 31 teams. The top five teams received trophies in the following competitions: Active Shooter, Crisis Intervention, Traffic Stops, In-Progress, Crime Scene Investigation, and Search and Arrest. OBPD placed fifth in the In-Progress scenario.

At the conclusion of the conference, Sergeant D.W. Smith was nominated for the South West Representative Florida Association of Police Explorers for the adult board and Officer Lauren Sanders was nominated for the Central East Representative for the adult board. The adult boards are advisory boards and deal with Explorer related issues and setting up events, conferences and meetings for the Explorers. The nominations are made at the end of the conference to handle the following year's events and issues.

The association consists of approximately 100 police departments and sheriffs offices throughout the State of Florida. Within the association there is an adult board and a youth board which consist of numerous positions that handle a variety of assignments.

PARKS

Building Maintenance



The Leisure Services Building Maintenance crew is always hard at work keeping all of our City facilities in top order, and this week was no exception. Staff worked diligently with projects including plumbing, HVAC repairs, carpentry repairs, electrical repairs, and general maintenance. In addition, staff spends time picking up supplies and ensuring that supplies and projects are quoted for the best possible price and quality for the job.

Weekly duties include preventative maintenance of City vehicles and equipment, and maintenance on the fountains at the Performing Arts Center, Arroyo Park, Riviera Park, Hospital Gardens Park, Fortunato Park and City Hall. Inspections on the water wheel and sump pumps in Rockefeller Gardens are also done each week.

Tri-weekly inspections of DOT and facility lighting are performed at various city locations, and of the lighting on the air-field runways, taxiways and signage.

FLOW Mobile

The Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles “Florida Licensing On Wheels” (FLOW) mobile unit will be at City Hall on **Tuesday, July 12, from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.**

FLOW is a standalone mobile office with technology to provide most motorists’ needs. It provides drivers license/ID card change of address, renewals, replacements, and renewals and replacements of vehicle registration and disabled parking permits, as well as other needs. The only thing FLOW does not provide is for the drivers’ license road test.

FLOW brings services to the local communities offering a convenience to citizens while saving them time and gas.




