Free Paternity Workshop

Community Legal Services of Mid-Florida (CLSMF) has partnered with the City of Ormond Beach to offer free quarterly workshops to interested individuals.

The next quarterly workshop topic is **“Paternity,” rights of non-married parents**. The workshop will be held on **Thursday, September 1st**, from **3:30-5:00 p.m. in Conference Room 103 in City Hall located at 22 S. Beach Street**. Conference Room 103 is located just before the elevator on the first floor when entering City Hall from the breezeway between the Library and City Hall.

During each workshop, a specific legal topic will be presented by a pro bono attorney. After the presentation, individuals can get their generic questions answered.

If attendees wish to meet one-on-one with a pro bono attorney regarding their specific situation, they will need to indicate so on the sign-in sheet upon their arrival and they will be contacted at a later date, by phone, to have an intake completed to establish eligibility for services. Intakes will not be completed at the quarterly workshops. Attendees who wish to have a one-on-one meeting with a pro bono attorney are encouraged to speak with Julie Rademacher, Pro Bono Co-ordinator, after the workshop has concluded.

Drain Standing Water

- Mosquitoes can be produced in the tiniest of containers including water bottle caps
- Drain or flush water from containers in your yard (bird baths, kiddie pools, etc.) every week
- Discard unused containers in your yard

Cover Your Skin

- Use insect repellent
- Use mosquito netting on cribs, strollers and baby carriers
- Keep doors and windows shut
- Keep screens on all windows, repair holes in screens
