
Thanks to the Blue

Lunch & Learn at EDC

Only in Florida is a visual program on Florida endemic plants and animals and will be held on Thursday, August 18, from Noon-1:00 p.m. at the Environmental Discovery Center, 601 Division Avenue.

An endemic is a species that is naturally found only in a particular geographical area, and in this case, Florida. This program will show images of these interesting and unique inhabitants of the Sunshine State with information about each. The program will feature mostly plants and a few of the animals that are endemic to Florida as seen through the photography of Paul Rebmann. Information will include where they are found and how they are different from their more wide-ranging relatives. Some of the species that will be covered include Volusia County's *Deeringothamnus rugelii* (Rugel's false pawpaw), scrub species such as *Asclepias curissii* (Curtis' milkweed) and *Bonamia grandiflora* (Florida lady's nightcap), panhandle endemic *Harperocallis flava* (Harper's beauty) and many more.

Window Tint Film for Cars

...the Florida Law

Car window tinting laws in Florida were enacted in 1991. Specifically, Florida Laws (Florida State Statutes Section 316.2952) indicate how dark which windows can be and how reflective the tint is allowed in our state.



Generally, the laws indicate that you are not permitted to operate a motor vehicle on which any windows behind the driver are composed of or covered by, or treated with any sunscreening material, or other product or material which has the effect of making the window nontransparent or which would alter the window's color, increase its reflectivity or reduce its light transmittance except as is specified in the tables below.

There are also additional requirements about car window tinting and rules and regulations in Florida, so please make sure you read the specifics of the law at www.flsenate.gov/Laws/Statutes/2016/316.2952.

Tint darkness for Sedans:

- **Windshield:** Non-reflective tint is allowed above the manufacturer's AS-1 line.
- **Front Side windows:** Must allow more than 28% of light in.
- **Back Side windows:** Must allow more than 15% of light in.
- **Rear Window:** Must allow more than 15% of light in.



Tint reflection for Sedans:

- **Front Side windows:** Must not be more than 25% reflective.
- **Back Side windows:** Must not be more than 35% reflective.

Tint darkness for SUVs and Vans:

- **Windshield:** Non-reflective tint is allowed above the manufacturer's AS-1 line.
- **Front Side windows:** Must allow more than 28% of light in.
- **Back Side windows:** Any darkness can be applied 6 inches from the top of the window.
- **Rear Window:** Any darkness can be applied 6 inches from the top of the window.

Tint reflection for SUVs and Vans:

- **Front Side windows:** Must not be more than 25% reflective.
- **Back Side windows:** Must not be more than 35% reflective.

The Casements' Home Improvement

As homeowners know, nothing revives a house like a fresh coat of paint. The Casements is no exception! During the entire month of August, John D. Rockefeller's former winter home will undergo a few exterior renovations that will spruce up the historic landmark.

The Cultural Center's last external rejuvenation occurred seven years ago. In an effort to revamp the house before the busy holiday season approaches, The Casements Coordinator prompted the latest facelift. While the building will stay the same tan color with a fudge trim and white windows, fresh paint will undoubtedly brighten and enliven Mr. Rockefeller's humble abode.

Currently, the Riverside Drive mansion's telltale awnings, which flank the namesake windows, main entrance, and southern handicap accessible ramp, are absent. To prepare for the home's paint job, the awnings were removed; once painting concludes, they will be replaced. In addition, the cedar shakes on the recently redone towers, located on the stage in the Gardens, will be repainted to match the house.

Operating hours will continue as usual during the building's refurbishment. The Casements is open to the public from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday; docents provide tours at 1:00 p.m., 2:00 p.m., and 3:00 p.m. On Saturdays, the building operates from 8:00 a.m. until noon with tours at 10:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.



Drain Standing Water

- Mosquitoes can be produced in the tiniest of containers including water bottle caps
- Drain or flush water from containers in your yard (bird baths, kiddie pools, etc.) every week
- Discard unused containers in your yard

Cover Your Skin

- Use Insect repellent
- Use mosquito netting on cribs, strollers and baby carriers
- Keep doors and windows shut
- Keep screens on all windows, repair holes in screens
