## 911 Memorial Stair Climb

On Sunday, September 11, 2016, the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of 9/11, approximately 160 people took part in a memorial for the 343 firefighters who died on September 11, 2001, at the World Trade Center terrorist attack. Local firefighters, police officers, and civilians participated in the Memorial Stair Climb at Peck Plaza in Daytona Beach Shores remembering those who heroically gave their lives to save so many others on 9/11.

After a call went out at 8:46 a.m., the exact time the first plane hit the World Trade Center, the journey of remembrance began. Firefighters were in full gear (80 pounds) and each took a poker chip bearing the face of those who lost their lives on that fateful day in their honor. They climbed 110 stories which is exactly the number of stories in the World Trade Center. To reach 110 stories, each had to climb four times.

Ormond Beach Fire Department personnel who participated included Kyle Williams, Carrie Davis, Meghan Quartier, Nate Quartier, Eric Sommerlad, Robert Zalewski, and Sebastian Bejarano. Ormond Beach Police Department included Lisa Rosenthal and Amberly Michaelis. Agencies throughout the State of Florida participated in this event.

# Wild About Water

On Saturday September 10th, Joanna McKasy, a City employee and volunteer at the Environmental Discovery Center, presented a program at the Center entitled "All About Water." This program gave participants the opportunity to learn about collecting water data, including ways to measure the PH and chlorine levels in water and water depth, filtration methods, the different types of species that live in salt and fresh water, and much more.

The program also included a short clip from "Planet Earth" which showed where fresh water comes from and major sources of fresh water worldwide. At the end of the presentation the group participated in an activity that required them to work together in order to

achieve a common goal; saving an endangered species and getting them to an "animal hospital."
