DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION



At the beginning of this week, Deputy Mayor Bill Partington presented a proclamation to the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) in recognition of Constitution Week.

The National Society, Daughters of the American Revolution was founded on October 11, 1890, to perpetuate the memory and the spirit of the men and women who achieved American Independence, to promote the development of an enlightened public opinion, and to foster patriotic citizenship.

The Captain James Ormond Chapter of the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution was organized in 1966, in Ormond Beach. The Chapter was named for Captain James Ormond, whose family settled in Volusia County around 1790.

The observance of Constitution Week was started by the Daughters of the American Revolution. In 1955, DAR petitioned Congress to set aside the week of September 17-23 each year for the observance of Constitution Week. The resolution was later adopted by the U.S. Congress and signed into public law on August 2, 1956, by President Dwight D. Eisenhower.

“For more than two centuries, the Constitution has presided as the supreme law of the land, keeping our leaders true to America’s highest ideals and guaranteeing the fundamental rights that make our country a beacon of hope to all peoples seeking freedom and justice. Together with the Bill of Rights, our Constitution is the backbone of our government and the basis of our liberties;” *(excerpt from President Barack Obama’s Constitution Day Proclamation, September 16, 2011).*

The City of Ormond Beach urges all residents to reaffirm the ideals the framers of the Constitution had in 1787 by vigilantly protecting the freedoms guaranteed to us through this guardian of our liberties.

Corporal Tom Larsen was promoted to the rank of Police Sergeant effective Sunday, September 18, 2016. Sergeant Larsen has over 16½ years of experience serving the Ormond Beach community as a Patrol Officer, Criminal Investigator, Patrol Corporal and Criminal Investigations Corporal. During his tenure, he has also volunteered and served as a Field Training Officer, Hostage Negotiator and Traffic Homicide Investigator. Sergeant Larsen served six years in the United States Marine Corps and participated in Operation Provide Comfort, Operation Southern Watch, Operation Restore Hope and Operation Continue Hope. Sergeant Larsen is the supervisor in charge of the ALPHA shift.



PARKS

ORMOND BEACH CIVIL AIR PATROL CADETS



A team of cadets from the Ormond Beach Composite Squadron of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP) has been organized to participate in the National Youth Cyber Education Program, also known as CyberPatriot. By participating in CyberPatriot, the cadets will be introduced to exciting information technology career paths. In addition to learning teamwork and organizational skills that set them apart in the STEM (Science Technology Engineering Mathematics) job market, participants benefit from direct tutelage by industry professionals that volunteer through the CyberPatriot Mentor Program.

At the center of CyberPatriot is the National Youth Cyber Defense Competition. The competition puts teams of high school and middle school students in the position of newly hired IT (Information Technology) professionals tasked with managing the network of a small company. In the rounds of competition, teams are given simulated business computer systems and are tasked with finding cybersecurity vulnerabilities within the systems. The teams must then reconfigure the systems to remove the vulnerabilities while maintaining critical services, all within a limited time period. Teams compete for the top placement within their state and region, and the top teams in the nation earn all-expenses paid trips to the National Finals Competition where they can earn national recognition and college scholarships.

Since 2011, the Northrop Grumman Corporation has generously awarded scholarships to members of the First Place, Second Place and Third Place National Finals teams, amounting to over \$300,000 in direct academic financial support to CyberPatriot competitors to date. Additionally, Northrop Grumman offers CyberPatriot Internships in offices around the country, providing participants professional cybersecurity experience straight out of high school.

Civil Air Patrol, the official auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force, is a nonprofit organization with more than 61,000 members nationwide, operating a fleet of 550 aircraft. CAP, in its Air Force auxiliary role, performs over 90 percent of domestic U.S. inland search and rescue missions as tasked by the Air Force Rescue Coordination Center. Its volunteers also perform homeland security, disaster relief and drug interdiction missions at the request of federal, state and local agencies. The members play a leading role in aerospace education and serve as mentors to nearly 27,000 young people currently participating in the CAP cadet programs.




Walking with the Manager



FLOW brings services to the local communities offering a convenience to citizens while saving them time and gas.


