Hurricane Matthew

On Friday, October 7, Hurricane Matthew blew into Ormond Beach as a Category 3 Hurricane. In the days before the storm, City staff diligently prepared for this major storm. During and after the storm, staff manned the Emergency Operations Center. City workers are working extremely hard in helping to get Ormond Beach back to normal.

The City has contracted two debris haulers, with many trucks on the road, working from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., seven days a week. Yard debris should be placed curbside for pick up, please do not place debris in the roadways as this will block access for emergency vehicles and the trucks picking up the debris. Construction debris must be kept separate from yard debris.

Leisure Services facilities, including parks - please see the list on page two for anticipated re-opening dates of City parks and facilities.

The precautionary boil water notice was lifted on Tuesday, October 11.

Volusia County's Citizens Information Center is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. until further notice. The phone number is 866-345-0345.

Tree removal permits have been temporarily suspended. Permit fees for work related to the hurricane are waived; however, contractors are required to go to the Planning/Building office at City Hall, 22 S. Beach Street, to show that they are licensed to do work, and a paper permit will be issued. **Citizens are cautioned to hire Florida licensed contractors only and to be wary of door-to-door solicitors asking for large deposits or who promise to speed up the permit process.**

We are appreciative of all the workers, local and from other areas, who are helping to restore Ormond Beach! The City thanks its citizens for their patience and cooperation while our community is being brought back to the high standards typical of Ormond Beach.





Florida's Move-Over Law

Florida Statute 316.126



The Ormond Beach Police Department would like to remind motorists of the Florida Move-Over Law (FSS 316.126). The Move-Over Law requires motorists driving on a highway with two or more lanes to vacate the lane closest to the emergency, utility, sanitation, or wrecker vehicle or slow down to 20 MPH below the speed limit when approaching these types of vehicles parked on the side of the roadway when their emergency lights or signal are displayed. If you are not in the lane closest to the stopped emergency, utility, sanitation, or wrecker vehicle, you should be prepared to allow other drivers to move over.

The purpose of this law is to protect emergency, utility, sanitation or wrecker workers from being struck by vehicles passing them at high speeds. Due to the debris and power outages attributed to Hurricane Matthew, numerous utility and sanitation vehicles are working throughout Volusia County.

OBYBA YOUTH COED BASKETBALL REGISTRATION

Registration for the Ormond Beach Youth Basketball Association (OBYBA) Coed Basketball League will take place through October 31, 2016, for boys and girls ages 5 -16 (age as of September 1, 2016) at the City of Ormond Beach Leisure Services Department Registration Office, 399 N US 1. Office hours are Monday through Thursday 7:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. and Friday 7:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. You may contact the office at (386) 676-3250. Registrations can also be done online at www.ormondbeach.org if a current General Information Form has been completed previously by a parent.

Children must register no later than October 31 and must attend the skill assessment/tryouts. Skill assessment dates and times will be given out at time of registration.

The fee for City of Ormond Beach residents ages 5-7 is \$50, and \$85 for non-residents. For ages 8-16, the resident fee is \$65, and \$100 for non-residents. Proof of residency is required to receive the City resident rates. If registered prior to October 31, your child will be enrolled in a free pre-season clinic to be held Saturday, November 5, at 1:00 p.m. at the Nova Community Center.

Practices will begin as early as November 21 with games being played December 5 through February 24, 2017.

Coaches, Sponsors and League Directors are needed. Coaches need to attend the November 5 pre-season clinic and the November 12 and 14 tryouts/skill assessments.
