State of the City



On Tuesday, October 25, the City of Ormond Beach, in partnership with the Ormond Beach Chamber of Commerce, held the annual State of the City address at Oceanside Golf and Country Club. Approximately 180 people attended the event.

Mayor Ed Kelley's video presentation focused on this year's theme of "Ormond Beach, An Investment of a Lifetime." The presentation highlighted the diversity of businesses in Ormond Beach and the Business Park, and businesses who have relocated or expanded in Ormond Beach.

This year's ACE (Award for Civic Engagement) recipients were Debbie Kruck Forrester, Ormond Strong, and Bill Jones, The Highlander Corporation.

Mrs. Forrester created Ormond Strong in February 2015, to support the 200+ local soldiers who were deployed to Afghanistan. To build awareness of and support for these soldiers, Mrs. Forrester led a "vigil bridge walk" every morning at 7:30 on the Granada Bridge for 380 days. Mrs. Forrester also organized monthly meetings for military families, and helped link the community with the troops overseas through various events, such as fundraisers to send care packages to the troops.

Mr. Jones was recognized for his commitment to and investment in Ormond Beach. Mr. Jones came from the northeast and is a long term resident of Ormond Beach. He owns numerous buildings in the downtown and has invested significant funds to help the revitalization efforts in the downtown. Mr. Jones has shown by his actions that Ormond Beach is truly "an investment of a lifetime." In addition to receiving the ACE award, Mayor Kelley presented Mr. Jones with the Key to the City.



As this was Mayor Kelley's last State of the City, the Chamber of Commerce presented him with a proclamation which recognized his endeavors as mayor and naming October 25, 2016, as Mayor Ed Kelley Day. The Chamber gave Mayor Kelley the designation of Chamber Board Member Emeritus and a lifetime membership.

Disaster Recovery Workshop

On Wednesday, October 26, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Representative Ron DeSantis hosted a comprehensive recovery assistance workshop at the Nova Community Center Gym, 440 North Nova Road, for Volusia and Flagler County residents affected by Hurricane Matthew.



Approximately 250 citizens from area cities attended the workshop, which was held to continue to help facilitate recovery efforts in areas impacted by Hurricane Matthew. In addition to Representative DeSantis, also in attendance were members of the legislature, or their staff, from the offices of Senator Marco Rubio (U.S. Senate), Senator Dorothy Hukill (Florida Senate, District 8), Paul Renner (Florida House of Representatives, District 24), Representative Fred Costello (Florida House of Representatives, District 25), and Representative David Santiago (Florida House of Representatives, District 27).

Construction Debris Collection



In order for construction materials to be collected, they must be separated from vegetative yard debris. If the materials are mixed, the entire pile will not be collected until the first pass of vegetative debris collection has been completed. As the City's vegetative debris removal teams Crowder Gulf and DRC are collecting, Waste Pro is also collecting construction materials.

For the safety of all vehicles and for emergency vehicle access, residents are reminded that roads are not to be blocked with any type of debris and that the debris for collection must be kept on their property.

Hurricane Matthew Storm Debris, Halloween Safety and Area Events

As our contractors continue debris removal associated with Hurricane Matthew, the City of Ormond Beach would like to remind residents to exercise extreme caution near debris piles this Halloween weekend.

Debris piles on the public right-of-way are a safety hazard for pedestrians and for trick-or-treaters. These piles may obstruct sight-lines for motor vehicles traveling along the roadways and may also contain sharp objects such as broken limbs and woody debris, or harbor snakes and pests. Additionally, debris piles are a potential fire hazard with leaves and branches drying out.

Please do not allow children to play on or around debris piles and avoid areas with large quantities of debris piled for collection. Our contractors are working as quickly as possible to collect debris and all residents are urged to make personal safety a top priority as Ormond Beach continues its recovery from Hurricane Matthew.



Visit SBA's Business Recovery Centers for Disaster Assistance for Hurricane Matthew

ATLANTA – The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) announced today the opening of Business Recovery Centers (BRC) in Saint Johns and Volusia counties on Monday Oct. 31 to help Florida businesses impacted by Hurricane Matthew on Oct. 3 - 19, 2016.

“If your business sustained structural damages or losses to inventory, machinery or equipment, or if you have disaster-related working capital needs, we encourage you to consider applying for a low-interest disaster loan from SBA,” said Volusia County’s Emergency Manager Jim Judge. “There’s no cost to apply for federal disaster assistance and these loans can help businesses recover from damages caused by Hurricane Matthew.”

SBA representatives at the Business Recovery Center (BRC) can provide information about disaster loans, answer questions and help businesses in completing the SBA application. No appointment is necessary. The Centers are located as indicated below and will operate until further notice:

“A healthy business community is an essential ingredient to a thriving city and county. Most of our businesses are back open, and our job now is to make sure that they have what they need to get back to operating at full capacity and better than ever. We are pleased to be hosting a business recovery center so that we can quickly respond to our businesses’ needs,” said Isabelle Rodriguez President /CEO of the St. Johns County Chamber of Commerce.

The disaster declaration covers the counties of Brevard, Duval, Flagler, Indian River, **Nassau**, Putnam, Saint Johns, **Seminole** and Volusia in **Florida**, which are eligible for both Physical and Economic Injury Disaster Loans from the SBA. Small businesses and most private nonprofit organizations in the following adjacent counties are eligible to apply only for SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans: Alachua, Baker, Bradford, Clay, Lake, Marion, Okeechobee, Orange, Osceola and Saint Lucie in **Florida**; **Camden** and **Charlton** in **Georgia**.

Applicants may apply online using the Electronic Loan Application (ELA) via the SBA's secure website at <https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela>.

To be considered for all forms of disaster assistance, applicants should register online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov or by mobile device at m.fema.gov. If online or mobile access is unavailable, applicants should call the FEMA toll-free helpline at 800-621-3362. Those who use 711-Relay or Video Relay Services should call 800-621-3362.

Additional details on the locations of Disaster Recovery Centers and the loan application process can be obtained by calling the SBA Customer Service Center at 800-659-2955 (800-877-8339 for the deaf and hard-of-hearing) or by sending an email to disastercustomerservice@sba.gov.

The filing deadline to return applications for physical property damage is **Dec. 16, 2016**. The deadline to return economic injury applications is **July 17, 2017**.


