

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Ormond Beach Fire Department protects a community of approximately 38,000 residents living in an approximately 36 square-mile area within the City limits of Ormond Beach, as well as providing automatic aid through a Closest Unit Response Agreement with neighboring cities and the unincorporated areas of Volusia County, and providing essential services of Advanced Life Support (ALS) emergency medical services, disaster preparedness and response, fire and life safety education, fire protection, hazardous materials response, and technical rescue; and

WHEREAS, Michael Marstaller has done all of this during his 29-year career with the City of Ormond Beach. He started his career with the City on November 16, 1987, working for the Public Works Department, but on June 21, 1989, he transferred to the Fire Department, promoting to Driver Engineer on October 1, 1993, and then promoting to Captain on October 15, 1999; and

WHEREAS, emergency medical service is a vital public service that dramatically improves the survival and recovery rate of those who experience sudden illness or injury, and fighting fires is one of the most hazardous professions, requiring physical strength, stamina, extensive training, and courage—the Wildfires of 1998 and Hurricanes of 2004 were examples of Mike's training and courage. Over the years, he has served as the Fire Department's liaison for fire inspections and provided oversight of the fire reporting quality assurance program, as well as serving for 17 years as the Chairman of the Firefighter's Pension Board; and

WHEREAS, after 29 years of service to the City of Ormond Beach, Mike is looking forward to retiring and spending time with his wife, Maria, and sons Chris and Matthew;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ed Kelley, Mayor of the City of Ormond Beach, Florida, do hereby proclaim October 3, 2016, as a day to honor




