Fond Farewell

November 1, 2016, marked the final City Commission meeting for Mayor Ed Kelley and Zone 1 Commissioner James Stowers for the current term. Mayor Kelley was Zone 3 Commissioner from 1994-1997; in 2005, he was elected Zone 3 Commissioner in a special election and retained the Zone 3 Commission seat until 2010, when he ran for and was elected Mayor.

Zone 1 Commissioner James Stowers was elected to office in 2010. Commissioner Stowers has continued to be elected as Zone 1 Commissioner since that time. Earlier this year, Commissioner Stowers announced that he would not run for the City Commission.

Mayor Kelley and Commissioner Stowers will continue as part of the City Commission until midnight on Monday, November 14.

Mayor-Elect Partington led the recognition on behalf of the City. Former Mayors Carl Persis and Dr. Fred Costello, along with numerous citizens, came out to recognize Mayor Kelley and Commissioner Stowers and thank them for their service to the Ormond Beach community. Staff from Representative DeSantis' office were on hand and gave Mayor Kelley and Commissioner Stowers a certificate of recognition for their service to the community.



Employee of the Quarter and Year



This week, during the November 1 City Commission meeting, Marty Hayes was recognized as the Employee of the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2015-2016. At the same time, Marty received a surprise as he was recognized as Employee of the Year!

Marty Hayes began his employment with the City of Ormond Beach on August 27, 1984, as a Utility Service Helper I in the Wastewater Section of the Utilities Division shortly after his graduation from Seabreeze High School and during the era of Van Halen. During his long tenured period with the City's utilities crews, Marty's acquired expertise along with his devotion to his co-workers and customers resulted in his advancement to the position of Wastewater Collection-Reuse Systems Foreman.

Marty recently served the City as interim Supervisor for the Wastewater Collection/Reuse

Systems Utilities work section from November 2015 through May 2016. During this time Marty assumed the supervisory responsibilities for the section and relied upon his vast experience with the City's wastewater collection and reuse operating systems to effectively supervise and manage the preventative maintenance, trouble-shooting and manpower scheduling activities, equipment and materials needs, plans review and additional administrative support activities required of a typical section crew supervisor.

Marty has for many years played a key role in the City's Utilities Division by overseeing field training for most new employees on the day-to-day wastewater collection and reuse system operational support functions. Marty has also prepared and trained most Public Works employees (45 & counting) for the Commercial Driver's License (CDL) testing with 100% passing rate. Marty also remains a renowned figure in the western Ormond Beach areas of Breakaway Trails and Hunter's Ridge as the "go to guy" for most any utility related customer inquiry. Over the years, Marty has received numerous accolades from customers, both for his actions and customer-friendly attitude.

Marty continues his passion for working on old cars and trucks. He also enjoys hunting, fishing and running his dogs when he can find the time. He also enjoys visiting and playing guitar with his brother Kenny, who he says plays better than him only because he is already retired from the City's Police Dept. and has more time to practice.

Over the past thirty-two years, Marty Hayes has provided a long standing commitment to serve the City, his co-workers and its customers. Marty genuinely cares about others and has on more than one occasion been the primary City contact for offering support to family members and their children during a critical illness of a co-worker. Marty continues to illustrate his willingness to go above and beyond his normal duties to troubleshoot a problem or serve in a supervisory capacity when called upon.

Congratulations Marty!


Storm Debris Update

The City continues to receive inquiries as to when the debris from Hurricane Matthew will be picked up on their street. The City is making headway and we ask that you be patient, knowing we are committed to getting the job done as quickly and as safely as possible.

The City's contractors, DRC and Crowder Gulf, continue debris collection from the City's rights-of-way. As of the close of business on Thursday, November 3rd, 5,517 loads of debris had been collected (262,334 cubic yards) in 25 days. They have also removed 97 leaning trees and 4,114 hanging limbs. The daily report for debris collection through Thursday, November 3rd, is below along with an updated map of areas where a first pass has occurred as indicated by red dots. Each dot does not represent a household, but rather an area where debris has been pushed into a pile and picked up.

We would like to continue reminding residents of the following:

- Our Public Works Department will continue clearing debris from roadways to ensure safe passage for emergency and passenger vehicles.
- Safety is a primary concern, and residents are asked to not block roadways with any type of debris and that debris for collection must be kept on their property.
- "Root balls" and "stumps" will not be collected at the same time as logs or brush materials as they are handled differently for final disposal and must be collected separately. These will be removed after the removal of all other storm debris.
- If you hire a contractor for tree removal services or roof repairs/replacement, they are required to remove the debris from your property and properly dispose of it.
- Burning of commercial waste, residential trash, garbage, lawn debris, clippings, trees or other debris on residential, commercial or industrial property is prohibited within the City. (City of Ormond Beach Code of Ordinances Section 9.2)


