Election Day at The Casements

On November 8, 2016, millions of Americans exercised their civic duty and cast their vote for the next President of the United States. Volusia County alone houses 387,417 registered voters.

This year, The Casements resumed as a polling location, housing precinct 517. In 2014, the Supervisor of Elections moved the polling location for precinct 517 from The Casements to the Volusia County Regional Library at 30 South Beach Street, Ormond Beach. Commissioner Troy Kent brought his concerns regarding this move to the attention of the Supervisor of Elections. Happily, the polling location for precinct 517 was moved back to The Casements in time for the primary election, which was held in August of this year.

On Monday morning, Election Board members arrived at The Casements to begin setting up voting booths in the gallery. Then on Tuesday, before the sun rose over the Atlantic, staff opened the cultural center for Volusia County poll workers. From 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Ormond Beach residents in precinct 517 reported to John D. Rockefeller, Sr.'s, former winter home to participate in a historic election.

Overall, The Casements received a sizeable turnout for the 58th presidential election. Throughout the day, a steady stream of voters trickled into The Casements. Lines were longer during the early morning and evening hours, but wait times were manageable. At the end of the day, The Casements was honored to serve as a site where democracy flourishes.



STORM DEBRIS UPDATE


The City continues to receive inquiries as to when the debris from Hurricane Matthew will be picked up. The City's contractors, DRC and Crowder Gulf, will complete the first pass this week and begin the second pass on Monday, November 14th.

Contractors will be working on both the beachside and the mainland simultaneously. Once complete, the beachside units will be working west of N. Nova Road; and the mainland units, once complete, will work west of the N. Nova Road units and to the western boundary of City.

Yard debris must be kept separate from construction debris. Units will also begin, during the week of November 14th, to collect "root balls and stumps" as well as construction debris; however, these units will not be the same as those collecting yard debris.

As of the close of business on Thursday, November 10th, **7,060 loads of debris** had been collected (**344,440 cubic yards**) in **thirty-two** days. They have also removed **167 leaning trees** and **8,385 hanging limbs**. The daily report for debris collection through Thursday, November 10th, is attached along with an updated map of areas where a first pass has occurred as indicated by red dots. Each dot does not represent a household, but rather an area where debris has been pushed into a pile and picked up.




The Leisure Services Parks staff continues to concentrate their efforts on cleaning debris left from Hurricane Matthew on various park paths.
