Mayor and Commissioners Take Office



On Tuesday, November 15, 2016, the Ormond Beach City Commission began their new term of office, which is for two years ending in November 2018.

Prior to taking oaths of office, a reception was held in the City Hall Atrium which was filled with guests congratulating the Commission members.

Mayor Bill Partington was sworn in first by Judge David Walsh, followed by City Commissioners Dwight Selby (Zone 1), Troy Kent (Zone 2), Rick Boehm (Zone 3), and Rob Littleton (Zone 4).

Mayor Partington served on the Law Enforcement Advisory Board from 2002-2004 and has served on the Commission since 2004. Commissioner Kent has also served on the Commission since 2004 and was elected to the post of Deputy Mayor by his fellow Commission members for the 2016-2018 term. City Commissioner Rick Boehm served on the Leisure Services Advisory Board from 2004-2010 and is in his fourth term as City Commissioner. Mayor Partington, Zone 2 Commissioner Kent and Zone 3 Commissioner Boehm ran unopposed this election.

The new Commission members are Zone 1 Commissioner Dwight Selby and Zone 4 Commissioner Rob Littleton. Commissioner Selby is CEO of Selby Realty, Inc., and is a member of the Ormond Beach Chamber of Commerce, Ormond MainStreet, Citizens for Ormond Beach, Ormond Beach Historical Society and Ormond Memorial Art Museum and Gardens. Commissioner Littleton is a certified tax preparer and tutor, and he owns and operates *Go Ormond!*. Commissioner Littleton has been an appointee to the District Advisory Committee and the Calendar Committee for Volusia County Schools.

On Thursday, November 10, the City of Ormond Beach held a complimentary luncheon for local veterans and those who currently serve in the military at the Ormond Beach Senior Center. The event, which was previously held at dinner, was moved to the lunch hour in response to the requests of veterans and to better accommodate their schedules.

The ceremonies began at 12:00 p.m. as guests were welcomed by Assistant Leisure Services Director Stefan Sibley. Mayor Bill Partington read the proclamation and Chaplain Rabbi Howard Schwartz gave the invocation. Civil Air Patrol, Ormond Beach Composite Squadron, Posted the Colors, followed by audience participation in the National Anthem and Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Rick Boehm, Vietnam War Veteran, introduced guest speaker Debbie Kruck-Forrester. Mrs. Forrester created Ormond Strong, an organi-

zation comprised of local citizens concerned with the welfare of our deployed service members. They have supported the Florida National Guard Air Defenses Battalions deployment to the Middle East from 2015-2016. Because of her actions supporting our service members Mrs. Forrester was honored by the Washington, D.C., National Organization as the Florida National Guards Wife of the Year for 2016.

Veterans stood and were recognized when the Blue Notes played the song for each branch of the service. A delicious buffet and live music with dancing from The Blue Notes was enjoyed by the guests.





STORM DEBRIS UPDATE

The City's contractors, DRC and Crowder Gulf, are underway with the second pass. They are working on both the beachside and the mainland simultaneously. Once complete, the beachside units will be working west of N. Nova Road; and the mainland units, once complete, will work west of the N. Nova Road units and to the western boundary of the City.

Yard debris must be kept separate from construction debris. Units will begin collecting "root balls and stumps" as well as construction debris; however, these units will not be the same as those who are collecting yard debris.

Guided Bird Walk

ers were able to spot multiple species of birds before even stepping foot on the trails around the park. Some of those included ospreys, egrets, anhinga's (snakebird), turkey vultures and black vultures. While on the walk, which lasted a little over an hour, many other types of birds were discovered.

Free Landlord/Tenant Workshop (Focusing on Tenants' Rights/Responsibilities)

Community Legal Services of Mid-Florida (CLSMF) has partnered with the City of Ormond Beach to offer free quarterly workshops to interested individuals.

The next quarterly workshop topic is landlords/tenants and focuses on the rights and responsibilities of tenants. The workshop will be held on Thursday, December 1st, from 3:30-5:00 p.m. in Conference Room 103 in City Hall located at 22 S. Beach Street. Conference Room 103 is located just before the elevator on the first floor when entering City Hall from the breezeway between the Library and City Hall.

During each workshop, a specific legal topic will be presented by a pro bono attorney. After the presentation, individuals can get their generic questions answered.

If attendees wish to meet one-on-one with a pro bono attorney regarding their specific situation, they will need to indicate so on the sign-in sheet upon their arrival and they will be contacted at a later date, by phone, to have an intake completed to establish eligibility for services. Intakes will not be completed at the quarterly workshops. Attendees who wish to have a one-on-one meeting with a pro bono attorney are encouraged to speak with Julie Rademacher, Pro Bono Coordinator, after the workshop has concluded.


