[] Sec. 10-29. Separation of solid waste, yard waste and ashes. Solid waste, yard waste and ashes shall each be placed and maintained in separate containers.

[] Sec. 10-31. Scattering prohibited generally. It shall be unlawful for any person to disturb or to scatter or spread about or cause to be disturbed or scattered or spread about any solid waste, yard waste or recyclable items.

[] Sec. 10-34. Preparation of garden trash.

[] (a) Yard waste shall be bundled or placed in solid waste bags, boxes or residential solid waste containers in readiness for collection once per week. No such bundle, bag, box or container shall exceed sixty (60) pounds in weight.

[] (b) Trees and hedge trimmings shall be cut to a length not to exceed four (4) feet and shall not exceed four (4) inches in diameter.

[] Sec. 10-37. Gross weight of solid waste containers. No solid waste containers can shall be so filled or loaded that the total weight of the can with its contents exceeds sixty (60) pounds.

[] Sec. 10-40. Placement for collection from residences. (a) All solid waste and yard waste placed for collection at residences shall be placed for collection in an accessible location as near the street or traveled right-of-way as possible but no closer than two (2) feet from the edge of the pavement, and secured from disturbance by animals.

[] Sec. 10-42. Time for placement. No residential solid waste, recycling or yard waste container shall be placed for collection before sundown of the day preceding on which such container is scheduled to be collected by the city. Following collection, no container shall remain in a location visible from any public thoroughfare after sundown of the day of collection. Any violation of this section may be brought before the Special Master for hearing.

[] Sec. 10-65. Contractor debris. It shall be the responsibility of the builders, building contractors and privately employed tree trimmers, tree surgeons and landscape and lawn maintenance contractors to remove at their own expense all yard waste and debris from the premises upon which they are working. This shall include limbs, tree trunks, roots, concrete slabs, concrete blocks, bricks and all other materials used or generated by contractors in the course of building, altering or service to the premises.

[] Sec. 10-66. Debris from clearing of vacant or occupied property. The removal of solid waste or yard waste caused by the clearing of a vacant or occupied lot shall be the responsibility of the owner of such lot, and the clearing of land on which a home or other structure has been built will be the responsibility of the owner.

This Compliance Guide has been issued to inform residents, contractors and the general public of the rules, regulations and ordinances for the safe, efficient collection and disposal of solid wastes. Listed below are excerpts from the City of Ormond Beach, Code of Ordinances, Chapter 10, Solid Waste, Yard Waste and Recycling.* Sec. 10-1 Definitions
As used in this chapter:

[] Solid Waste means all putrescible and non putrescible solid wastes (except body waste), consisting of both combustible or non combustible wastes, such as paper cardboard, wood, and similar materials, or discarded materials of whatsoever kind, which tend to decay or putrefy animal or vegetable wastes resulting from the handling, preparations and cooking of food.

[] Residential solid waste containers means a container made of metal or other satisfactory materials approved by the Director, and of not more than thirty (30) gallons capacity.

[] Yard Waste means vegetative organic matter resulting from the routine landscaping maintenance of the grounds of a developed residential property and includes such materials as tree and shrub trimmings, grass clippings and palm fronds.

[] Sec. 10-5. Solid wastes to be City Property. The ownership of solid waste, yard waste, residential recyclables, and construction and demolition debris set out for collection shall be vested in the city, its franchisees, or its contractor, as applicable. No person shall unlawfully remove any recycling container from the

property of another or remove from the property on which is located any item of solid waste, yard waste, residential recyclables or construction and demolition debris, which has/have been placed for collection by the City, its franchisees, or its contractor. Any person violating this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalties set forth in section 1-9 of the Code of Ordinances.

[] Sec. 1-9 General penalty; continuing violations. Whenever in this code, or in any ordinance of the City, any act is prohibited or is made unlawful or an offence or misdemeanor, or whenever in such Code or Ordinance the doing of any act is unlawful, and no specific penalty is provided thereof, the violation of any such provision of this Code, or any such Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500), or by imprisonment for not exceeding sixty (60) days or both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court. Each day any violation of this Code or any such Ordinance of the City shall continue shall constitute a separate offense.

[] Sec. 10-11. Frequency of residential collections. Solid waste accumulated by residences shall be collected at least two (2) times per week. Yard waste and Recycling once (1) per week.

[] Sec. 10-13. Limitations on quantity collected. (a) Residential. (i) Any person placing solid waste and/or yard waste in containers for collection, in a quantity which exceeds three (3) thirty (30) gallon containers shall be subject to an extraordinary service charge determined

by the Director in accordance with Section 10-16.

(ii) Any person placing solid waste and/or yard waste for collection in a quantity which exceeds one yard and is not placed in a container, shall be subject to an extraordinary service charge in accordance with Section 10-16.

[] Sec. 10-14. Contagious disease refuse. The removal of wearing apparel, bedding or other solid waste from homes or other places where highly infectious or contagious diseases have prevailed should be performed under the supervision of the Health Department. Such solid waste shall not be placed in containers for regular collection.

[] Sec. 10-15. Flammable or explosive refuse. Highly flammable or explosive materials shall not be placed in containers for regular collection but shall be disposed of as directed, at the expense of the owner or person in possession thereof.

[] Sec. 10-16. Fees for collection and disposal established. (d) Extraordinary Service. Where extraordinary service is required there shall be a \$42.31 trip charge (include 1st yard) and \$12.00 per yard thereafter.
