## **Engineering Components Inc. relocates manufacturing plant to Ormond Beach Business Park**

George Supino – President of Engineering Components, Inc. (ECI) has purchased an 11,000 square foot industrial building at 3 East Tower Circle in the Ormond Beach Business Park, which is located off Airport Road. The property was recently vacated by Delta P Carver who moved to 14 Sunshine Boulevard in the Business Park. ECI was previously located in Palm Coast, Florida.

Mr. Supino stated “I explored the regional real estate market and spoke to local municipal and county officials and business owners in Flagler, St. Johns and Volusia Counties. After careful consideration, I concluded that Ormond Beach was a business friendly city and decided to purchase 3 East Tower Circle.”

Joe Mannarino, Director of Economic Development stated “I was contacted by Mr. Supino in late January regarding his interest in purchasing 3 East Tower Circle. As part of his due diligence, I provided Mr. Supino with building plans and information regarding zoning regulations and property taxes.” Mr. Mannarino continued “We welcome ECI to the City and are pleased that Mr. Supino has made the decision to make the investment to relocate his operation to Ormond Beach.”

Mr. Supino has worked in the material handling industry since 1986 and he incorporated ECI in 2002. The company first started as a manufacturing representative agency selling several manufacturers’ products that supported conveyor systems, including sorting equipment, conveyors, and pallet flow and carton flow products throughout the U.S.

In 2006, ECI took on a distributor roll and started selling replacement parts for Postal Presort Machines and Airport Conveyors. ECI's success resulted from their ability to reverse engineer existing parts to either improve efficiencies or to reduce the cost of these components to the end users. ECI added warehouse and distribution center conveyor parts, and started supplying replacement parts to support local manufacturing companies in the area in 2010.

To better serve their customer's, ECI went from a manufacturer rep agency to a distributor/dealer based company in November 2013. In the very near future ECI will be supplying new conveyor systems as well. By year end, ECI will employ seven people and anticipates growth in both revenue and employee head count by 25% each year. ECI is expected to be completely moved in and under operation by May 12th.
