

# PROCLAMATION

**WHEREAS**, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

**WHEREAS**, this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and

**WHEREAS**, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and

**WHEREAS**, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife; and

**WHEREAS**, trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires, and countless other wood products; and

**WHEREAS**, trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community. Ormond Beach is committed to the environment and places high value on the trees in our community; and

**WHEREAS**, Ormond Beach has been named a Tree City for 28 years in a row and was recently awarded the Tree City Growth Award on the 6<sup>th</sup>; and

**WHEREAS**, today we celebrate Arbor Day by planting a tree at the Ormond Beach Elementary School;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Bill Partington, Mayor of the City of Ormond Beach, Florida, do hereby proclaim January 18, 2019, as

in the City of Ormond Beach and urge all citizens to support efforts to protect our trees and woodlands, and to support the city's urban forestry program, and further urge all citizens to plant trees to gladden the hearts and promote the well-being of present and future generations.
