- **Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Doug Wigley at 7:01 PM.

- **Roll Call**

Andrea Breazeale took roll call. Members present were: J. Rick Boehm, Andrea Bolles, Shannon Julien, Barbara Kelly, Jeremy Kiel, Doug Wigley and Ann Marie Zweifel. (7) Arrived later were Robert Bowling, Doug Thomas and Lori Tolland. Excused were Lucy Jackman, Mike Mitchener and Brian Nave.

Also present were: Leisure Services Director Robert Carolin and Recording Secretary Andrea Breazeale

- **Approval of March 13, 2019 Minutes**

A motion was made by Jeremy Kiel to accept the March 13, 2019 minutes and was seconded by Barbara Kelly. All were in favor; the motion passed unanimously.

- **Stanley Steamer Rocket**

Mr. Wakefield presented the car lift renderings to the board members to amend the initially executed Artifacts Loan Agreement between the City of Ormond Beach and Bill Jones regarding the City owned Stanley Steamer Rocket. A presentation was given to showcase the Steamer Rocket vehicle and how it will be displayed. The City has been gracious enough to let us display the Steamer Rocket at the Ormond Garage. The City initially requested the vehicle be displayed in the front windows. Today's presentation is to scale this alternative from the initial plan. The Wakefield car lift presented to the board is era correct. Today's mock-up shows it raised off the ground in the window. The City of Ormond Beach has already agreed to the initial plan of having the car enclosed in the window. During Mr. Wakefield's 16 year career with NASCAR, he has never seen a car that was on display in a glass enclosure. His focus in the design is to display it properly as well as keep it safe. The concept is to place a bar height counter around the car so no one has accessibility to the car for protection purposes. Rick Boehm noted he did an excellent job.

Rick Boehm made a motion to approve the renderings and it was seconded by Lori Tolland. All were in favor; the motion passed unanimously.

- **Board Member Updates:**

Jeremy Kiel (Pop Warner) - 24 families have registered for the golf tournament to be held on Friday, May 10th. They have received good feedback so far.

Changes to the Pop Warner organization were discussed with respect to weight limits that have hindered the success of the program. Dropping weight limits will help schools be more competitive with other leagues. A new hybrid system is being put in place to help schools compete and not limit those who are able to participate. It has been a challenge the last few years to fill rosters for this very reason.

The Board discussed getting back to one program with Pride to combine two talents into one great program. Barbara Kelly welcomed further discussion to discuss potential hurdles.

Robert Bowling (Soccer) - The last weekend of recreation soccer is coming up. It was a successful season. The yearly annual tournament will be held on May 17 & 18. 120 teams have registered to date.

Tryouts for August season are happening early this year, prior to Memorial Day. FYSA is now holding tryouts at the same time. Some are transferring back due to the soccer programs now being offered in the City of Ormond Beach.

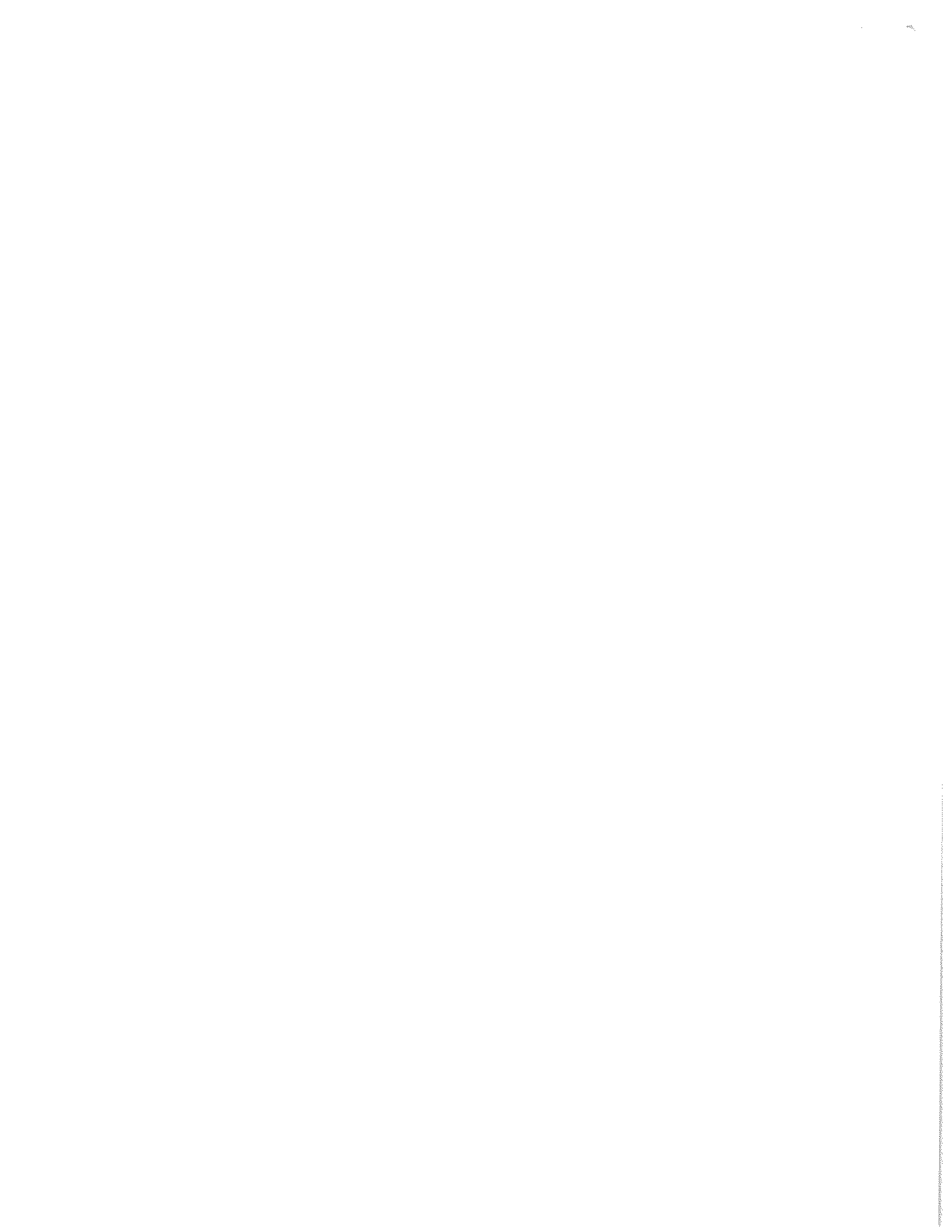
Barbara Kelly (OB Pride) - The board discussed sharing maintenance cost for concessions on Field 7 at the Ormond Beach Sports Complex. It is now Pop Warner's responsibility. A fee structure needs to be comprised for usage with an accrual at end of year that would then be reinvested into concessions.

Lori mentioned utilizing Friends of Recreation to collect and manage fees taken in for concessions.

Lori Tolland (Gymnastics) - Lori noted that George is doing well and thanked everyone's support while he has been out for physical therapy. Action was taken to add a part-time staff employee this week. Overall, the program is in good shape. No equipment needs to be ordered at this time.

Doug Wigley (Baseball) - Doug noted that T-ball's last day of the season is this coming Saturday. The program had 10 straight Saturdays without a rain out. Trophies have been delivered and plaques were sent to sponsors.

Playoffs are ongoing at Nova - Fields 2, 3, 4 and 5. They will wrap up the season in a week to 10 days.



The league for ages 7 and 8 are off until after MEAD.

All Stars and summer leagues are beginning soon.

Rick Boehm (Zone B) - Rick mentioned the Memorial Day dedication for the renaming and reopening of the Ike Leary fishing pier. It is in recognition of his 20 years supporting the fishing tournaments for the children of Ormond Beach near to his Bay House.

There will also be a dedication in June for the Fred Costella Amphitheater at Rockefeller Gardens. Rick is supportive of honoring dedicated City members while they are alive so their families can witness the recognition of their commitment to the City of Ormond Beach. Rick noted that Rockefeller Gardens was raised 4 feet to prevent flooding for the festival use that is now active throughout the year. Before, you could not hold festivals or events there. Fred was Mayor at the time and had a big part of making that happen.

Rick recommended the newly opened Lucky's Market to our non-profit organizations. Every quarter, Lucky's Market selects 3 local non-profits to donate and support making it a great opportunity to participate.

Shannon Julien (Mayor's Rep) - Shannon gave props to the Environmental Discovery Center for the list of ongoing activities as well as kudos to the team on event flyers and getting the good word out. Robert confirmed the City of Ormond Beach has a full time staff dedicated, Annie Evert, along with 30 strong volunteers. The team has made wonderful contacts with community organizations as well that support the program.

Summer Camp is coming up soon and registration should fill up quickly.

Andrea Bolles (Basketball) - Basketball season has come to an end. Andrea noted that registration numbers increased significantly. Expectations are to increase numbers even more next season.

Ann Marie Zweifel (Softball) - Recreation softball is ending next week. Ann noted a skills competition will be hosted and trophies will be given to all teams participating.

A Renegade tryout was held with a lot of interest. A total of 30 children participated.

High School tryouts are this coming weekend. Numbers are picking back up which is a positive.


