***UPDATED RESIDENT INFORMATION**

The Department of Public Works Operations Section would like to “Welcome you” to the City of Ormond Beach. This guide is intended to inform you of the policies and procedures for solid waste, yard waste and recycling collections. The City prides itself on “Customer Satisfaction” with the services provided to you, as a resident of Ormond Beach.

Solid Waste Collection

The City of Ormond Beach is pleased to introduce you to Waste Pro of Florida, Inc. as your solid waste, yard waste and recycling contract hauler.

Each residential home will receive solid waste collection **twice (2x) per week**. For your convenience we have circled those days on the back page.

Solid waste and recycling containers may be placed curbside after sundown the day before collection or by 7:00 a.m. the day of, and returned by sundown the day of. Solid waste and yard waste containers are the responsibility of the individual homeowner, and are to be constructed of metal or suitable plastic and not to exceed **thirty 30 gallons** in capacity and **sixty 60 pounds** when full.

All types of animal waste, sawdust, or ashes must be placed in non-returnable containers, i.e. bagged or boxed, to prevent exposure to collection personnel.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Is scheduled for WEDNESDAY only. Please place yard waste separate from solid waste and recycling containers.

Yard waste consists of grass clippings, palm fronds, tree trimmings and any other vegetative matter.

FREE collection of yard waste, “created by the homeowner only,” is unlimited. Yard waste generated by a “contractor” is subject to an “Extraordinary” Service Charge of a \$35.00 trip charge and \$10.00 per yard collected.

Additional items collected curbside:

Used motor oil (limit 5 gal./yr.)
Vehicle batteries
Waste tires (limit 4/yr.) (without rim)
Old appliances
These items will be collected on your second solid waste collection day.

RECYCLING PROGRAM

As a new resident, you will receive one (1) 18 gallon “**blue**” recycling bin. The following is a brief rundown of the currently collected recyclables:



NEWSPAPERS and their inserts placed on the bottom of your bin or in a brown paper grocery bag;

ALUMINUM CANS, which may be crushed to conserve space;

STEEL/TIN CANS including soup, vegetable, dog/cat food rinsed;

PLASTIC pourable food or beverage containers to include #1 (PET) and #2 HDPE), rinsed;

MAGAZINES of all types, i.e. Time, Newsweek, Star, Globe, National Enquirer and all types of catalogs;

TELEPHONE BOOKS placed in your bin throughout the year;

OCC (old corrugated cardboard) must be flattened, (2’x2’ sq. with contents removed) include cereal, 12 pack cont., etc. and may be placed in a brown paper grocery bag.



***ATTENTION**

Beginning April 1, 2019

GLASS containers, clear, brown or green in color, are no longer marketable and their collection will be suspended. Glass containers should be placed in your solid waste container for disposal.
